2020 BURGUNDY EN PRIMEUR A VIBRANT VINTAGE







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Our buying team was in Burgundy in October 2021 to taste and assess the 2020 vintage as it matured in the growers' cellars. In these pages, we are delighted to present the vintage and our selections.

The 2020 Growing Season and Harvest

The weather was clement leading up to the all-important flowering period, which started early, in mid-May. It went through speedily and in favourable weather, which is always a key herald of fine quality. A successful flowering allows all the grapes in a given bunch to come to full ripeness together. It also enables growers to forecast when the grapes will change colour, come to maturity and need harvesting. So from late-May, it was evident that 2020 would be an early harvest. Plans could be laid for early holidaying, and for pickers to be booked for a mid- to late-August start to the vintage.

Temperatures, rain and sunshine fluctuated during June but summer was about to arrive. July was very dry and hot, with several heatwave moments, and some bunches were grilled by the sun. Early August remained dry and hot, and it became apparent that, without rain to swell the grapes, this would be a highly concentrated, low-yield vintage - as proved to be the case.

It was the driest season since 1945, according to the Dijon weather station, with rainfall 50% down on recent levels, and 20% more sunshine than normal. Growers were concerned that the year might resemble 2003, when an August heat-wave caused leaves to wilt and grapes to shrivel. Fortunately, in 2020 the reserves of water in the soil allowed vines to withstand high temperatures with fortitude, to maximise their natural sugars and to ripen tannins and grape-skins. The dry weather allowed natural acidities to be concentrated, which was a crucial factor, giving superb balance in the resulting wines. On sorting tables, those grapes which had been sunburnt needed to be removed, but otherwise the bunches were immaculately healthy.

The 2020 Reds

Given the heat and dryness of the summer, we were concerned that some of reds would have become overripe, with alcohol levels which would dominate their fruit intensity, and that they might lack freshness. It has been a wonderful surprise to taste wines of such vivaciousness, where the terroir origins show forth brilliantly – in many cases, more clearly than in the two previous, powerful, sun-rich vintages, 2019 and 2018. 2020 red Burgundies have superb potential for ageing, and look destined to be hailed as one of Burgundy's most exciting, recent years. There are great examples at First Growth and Grand Cru levels, and we will also be highlighting many village level and regional wines, which show beautiful quality and lovely value.

The 2020 Whites

In both 2019 and 2018, plentiful summer sunshine resulted in plump, rich wines, which are round and soft - in many cases, already making luscious drinking. The 2020 whites have intense fruitiness, with balancing, crisp, long aftertastes. Individual origins are more clearly delineated than in the two previous vintages. This is a real classic, which may be enjoyed while youthful, but where the best wines have superb concentration, and will age magnificently.

We know that frost damage in April 2021 will mean reduced availabilities of the 2021 vintage, which will be offered next year. Now is a good moment to stock up with 2020s, in both reds and whites, across the quality ranges.

Late Release Domaines

This offer features the 2020 wines from the majority of the Burgundy Domaines we work with. However, a small number will release their offer to us later in the year, at which stage we will communicate the details and our notes. For the first time, Domaine Jean-Marc Bouley joins this list.

When making our allocations, preference will be given to loyal HH&C customers who buy a wide spread of our wines throughout the year.

Domaine Daniel Dampt & Fils, Chablis

Daniel Dampt and his two sons Vincent and Sébastien make very pure, intensely fruity wines, with the crisply dry, long finish of signature Chablis. Oak casks are never used on their First Growths, allowing the individual characters to shine out purely and intensely.

The 2020 summer was so dry and warm that protective sprayings could be reduced, and the harvest began here on 27th August. Some rain in mid-August helped to finish the maturation, and ensured that the crop was of reasonable volume. These are elegant wines with good concentration, being beautifully balanced.

Chablis 1er Cru Les Lys

Domaine Daniel Dampt & Fils 2020

This is the oldest block the family owns, the vines being around 60 years old. Located within First Growth Les Vaillons, it has been made separately since 2001, when its individuality and length of flavour were first recognised. The vines are tilted towards the north, allowing good acidities to be maintained in a warm vintage like 2020. Colour is lemon-gold, the nose being floral, fine and open. Palate is full and silky, with a long, dry finish (for drinking 2022-2025+). 12x75cl 180.00

The major part of this cuvée come from Les Lys, here assembled with neighbouring Séchet and Châtain. This is lemon-gold, with fresh, fine aromas and impressively tense, concentrated flavours, more richly bodied than the pure Les Lys – also fresh and long (for drinking 2022-2026+).

Chablis 1er Cru Côte de Léchet *Domaine Daniel Dampt & Fils 2020*

Located on the hillside leading up from the village of Milly, where Daniel Dampt is based, this Premier Cru consistently gives a wine of exceptional concentration, with the Domaine's greatest ageing potential. Pale, green-gold in colour, this shows aromas which are ripe, opulent and spicy. Palate is fullbodied, with rich fruit intensity, well-balanced acidity and splendid length (for drinking 2023-2028+). 12x75cl 180.00 6x150cl 190.00



Chablis 1er Cru Fourchaume

Domaine Daniel Dampt & Fils 2020 Fourchaume is to Chablis what Charmes is to Meursault – often the most ebullient, luscious First Growth on the block, and the one you can start to enjoy immediately! There is more clay in the soil than is found in other First Growths at the Domaine, so these are always among the earliest grapes to ripen. Green-golden in colour, it has richly floral, open aromas of great beauty. Palate is concentrated, with bright fruitiness, charming texture and vivacious finish (for drinking on arrival, or keeping 2-3 years more). 12x75cl 195.00

Domaine Christian Moreau Père & Fils, Chablis

Christian Moreau and his son Fabien's estate is concentrated on the right bank of the river Serein, with terrific Grand Cru holdings, in addition to one of the region's most superb First Growths: the Premier Cru Vaillon Cuvée Guy Moreau. These wines all come from Domaine vineyards, except for the Chablis 2020, where grapes from 1.5 ha. of estate vineyard are supplemented by fruit from two other plots, from which the Moreau family has been buying for 15 years. Natural sugars this vintage were slightly lower than in 2019, while acidities were similar, giving wines of classic balance and great beauty.

Chablis 1er Cru Vaillon Cuvée Guy Moreau

Domaine Christian Moreau Père & Fils 2020 These vines are more than 85 years old. The plot dates from 1933, "planted by my grandfather," says Christian "and still in super condition. We are taking cuttings from these vines, for replanting our vineyards in the future." The wine was fermented 50% in oak barrels, the balance in tank. Bright, green-golden in colour, with tightly concentrated aromas which are not yet developed, this shows rich structure, splendid weight of fruit and crisp, complex aftertaste (for drinking 2022-2027).

Chablis Grand Cru Vaudésir

Domaine Christian Moreau Père & Fils 2020

This tiny Grand Cru is un-matched for its elegance, fragrance and exceptional harmony. Planted in 1998, the roots of the vines have now penetrated deep into the limestone, bringing impressive complexities. South-facing, it ripens fast, and is always one of the first to be harvested. Colour is green-golden, aromas being open, lemony and fine. Palate shows impressive fruit intensity, with silky texture and beautiful, fresh length (for drinking 2021-2028+).

Chablis Grand Cru Valmur Domaine Christian Moreau Père & Fils 2020

These vines, planted in 1963, are more than 55 years old, and have again given a wine of impressive structure, fruit concentration and power. Production is always tiny, and this fermented partially in oak barrels, partially in tank. Green-golden in colour, this shows great aromatic freshness, while the palate has power, fruit intensity and crispness, needing bottle age to develop its full complexity (for drinking 2023-2030+).



Chablis Grand Cru Blanchot

Domaine Christian Moreau Père & Fils 2020 The vines are over 30 years old, but it is a small plot, giving only two barrels this vintage. Colour is pale, green-golden; aromas are spicy, fine and fruity; palate shows rich attack, then impressive flavours and depth, finishing creamy, crisp and long (for drinking 2023-2030+). 6x75cl 220.00



Chablis Grand Cru Clos

Domaine Christian Moreau Père & Fils 2020

The Domaine owns a magnificent 3 hectare plot of Les Clos, extending all the way up the hill to the trees. Many Chablis-lovers consider this the most classic, greatest Grand Cru of all. Vines are 65 years old in mid-slope, and 55 years old at the top. Bright, green-golden in colour, with aromas which are perfumed, elegant and fine, this has real power on the palate. Clos can be steely and closed when youthful, but this vintage shows opulence and silky texture, with balancing crispness (for drinking 2023-2032+).

Domaine Patrick Guillot, Mercurey

We have been shipping from this family Domaine in Mercurey for nearly ten vintages. Patrick Guillot entrusts his wines exclusively to us in the UK, and we are thrilled to have them. Located in Chamirey, a hamlet of Mercurey, Guillot's first harvest was 1988, when he had three hectares in production. He and his wife have slowly doubled the size of the Domaine, where all grapes are hand-picked, and where the most conscientious attention to all aspects of viticulture and wine-making result in striking successes. This is one of our favourite sources for superb-value bottles, with splendid reds and a striking white.

Mercurey Blanc 1er Cru Les Veley Domaine Patrick Guillot 2020 Fermented and aged primarily in a 500-litre oak barrel, with one normal-sized barrel alongside, for the balance of the harvest, this is golden-coloured, with open, fresh aromas. On the palate, a lovely harmony of concentrated, ripe fruitiness with fine acidity on the finish (for drinking 2022-2024+).	12x75cl	158.00

Mercurey Rouge Les Chavances <i>Domaine Patrick Guillot 2020</i> This wine comes from vines close to the Guillot home, with many dating back to 1980, 1963 and 1955. Deep purple in colour, it shows fragrant, fresh aromas, with powerful body, rich concentration and splendid vitality on the finish (for drinking 2022-2025+).	12x75cl	144.00
Mercurey Rouge En Boussoy Domaine Patrick Guillot 2020 These Pinots were planted in 1969, in shallow, red soils which are rich in clay and iron- oxides. The vines lie on a mini-plateau, just downhill from First Growth Clos des Montaigus. They are now being pruned to restrict their yields, so production has dropped. It was a mere 2 barrels in 2020 – one of which was new, and oakiness has been well integrated. Rich, purple-ruby in colour, this has intense, fully ripened aromas, with good structure and dense fruitiness (for drinking 2023-2027+). Do look at the price of this and the Chavances, above - vintages of this wine get snapped up early for their value and deliciousness.	12x75cl	144.00

Mercurey Rouge 1er Cru Clos des Montaigu

Domaine Patrick Guillot 2020

This is one of Mercurey's greatest terroirs for red wine, and rightly classified a First Growth. The vineyard was carefully replanted between 1988 and 1999, so the vines are now on average 25 years old. They must have put their roots down deep, for this is superb. Colour is rich purple, aromas are fragrant and generous, palate is round, elegant and harmonious with silky, fine tannins (for drinking 2024-2030+).

Mercurey rouge 1er Cru "Les Trois Louves"

Domaine Patrick Guillot 2020

A plot within Clos des Montaigus was planted in 2001 with the little-seen Pinot Noir Clone No. 943. This produces bunches where the grapes hang loose around their stems, giving a wine of exceptional fruit, and the silkiest of tannins. Only 3 barrels were made that year, fermented in a tiny tank, with Guillot's wife and their two daughters all helping - sometimes with bodies in the vat, to do foot-punching-down and also to hand up buckets, which is the only way to empty out the skins and stems, after fermentation. Chamirey is a tiny hamlet, whose inhabitants were known as stay-at-homes. They never ventured far afield, like wolves in their dens, whence their nick-name: "Les Loups de Chamirey." In naming this special cuvée Les Trois Louves, Patrick Guillot pays tribute to the 3 she-wolves in his family, without whom this sumptuous wine could not have seen the light of day. Just 2 barrels have been made in 2020, showing solid, deep purple colour, fresh, yet presently discreet aromas, and sumptuous fruitiness on the palate, with gentle, creamy aftertaste (for drinking 2024-2032+).

Domaine Claudie Jobard, Demigny

Burgundian vines and wine-making are part of Claudie Jobard's DNA. Her mother Laurence was for many years the highly-respected head winemaker at Joseph Drouhin, and her family runs a nursery which multiplies vines for replanting top vineyards, throughout Burgundy.

Since 2002 Claudie has been making her own wines in Rully, and from 2011 took over responsibility for additional family vineyards, producing tiny quantities including two Pommards and a First Growth Beaune, Les Epenottes. 2020 is the 10th vintage we have shipped, and her wines have become favourites with all who try them. All vineyards are now cultivated organically. Montagny 1er Cru was a new offering last year, which we are delighted to offer again, as well as welcoming back her superb Rully 1er Cru Les Cloux.

Rully Blanc En Villerange Domaine Claudie Jobard 2020

This comes from a gently sloping vineyard to Rully's south. It faces south-east, being pebble rich, with clay. Drawing on the family's expertise with vines, it was planted with two, carefully-selected Chardonnay clones. 100% barrel-fermented, this was racked into vat in preparation for a planned November 2021 bottling, to capture its vibrant fruitiness. Green-golden in colour, it shows open, citrus aromas, with rich, rounded volume on the palate, and harmonious acidity (for drinking 2022-2025+).

Montagny 1er Cru Madeleine

Domaine Claudie Jobard 2020

When introducing her new bottling, Claudie told us: "Here we have both natural sugars and natural acidity – not always typical for Montagny, where sometimes acidity is lacking." Production was small in 2020, just 5 barrels, of which 3 had previously held fermenting wine for a year, while the other two were older. For this second vintage, we again find a wine of splendid harmony. This is green-gold in colour, with complex, well-ripened aromas. Palate is plump and fresh, without heaviness, showing lively aftertaste (for drinking 2022-2025+).

Rully 1er Cru Les Cloux

Domaine Claudie Jobard 2020

This is an east-facing, pebble-rich vineyard located near to First Growths Raclot and Rabourcé. It is one of the village's best sites, with vines now averaging over 50 years in age. This has entirely fermented in small barrels, of which 20% were new. Green-golden in colour, with aromas which are open, spicy and fresh, this is richly built and intensely fruity, with lively, long aftertaste (for drinking 2023-2028+).

Bourgogne Rouge Milliane Domaine Claudie Jobard 2020

Named for Claudie's great-grandmother (whose real name was Emilie-Anne) this comes 100% from 70+ year-old vines growing in the commune of Pommard. They lie where Pommard's best regional Bourgognes are made: opposite the château, not far from the plane-tree-lined RN 74. In colour, this is medium-deep, ruby puple, with fragrantly fresh aromas. Palate shows bright fruitiness, intensity in the middle and vibrant aftertaste. If you love Pinot Noir, you will relish this wine (for drinking 2022-2025+).

Pommard Vieilles Vignes

Domaine Claudie Jobard 2020 This wine is an assembly of grapes from three plots: En Boeuf, La Combotte and Vaumuriens. The grapes were fully de-stemmed, and the wine has been ageing in small oak barrels, of which one third were new. Deeply coloured, it has open, lively, ripe aromas, with full, broad fruitiness on the palate, and splendid, rich aftertaste (for drinking 2024-2030+).

Beaune 1er Cru Les Epenottes

Domaine Claudie Jobard 2020

These vines are planted on clay-rich soil, downhill from Beaune Clos des Mouches, near Pommard's boundary. The bunches were fully ripened and handsome, so one third whole clusters went into the vat, forming mille-feuille layers, allowing the grapes to bathe gently in fresh-run juice, as the sugar transformations began. One third new oak, one third one-year, with one third two-year barrels are responsible for the gentle tending. The wine is medium deep in colour, highly perfumed, with striking fruit intensity, fine tannins, and gentle, mouth-coating length (for drinking 2024-2032+).



Pommard 1er Cru Les Charmots Domaine Claudie Jobard 2020

There are many short rows of vines here, so treatments have to be done by horse, by mini-caterpillar, or by humans, with a spray-tank on the back. The vines are over 100 years old, and gave just three barrels in 2020, one barrel being new, one a year old, one two years old. As with Beaune Epenottes, layers of whole clusters and de-stemmed grapes went into the vat. The result is magnificent: deeply purple in colour, with aromas which are rich, ripe and complete. Palate shows full fruitiness, with balanced structure, rounded tannins and floral, impressive aftertaste. This is a superb First Growth Pommard (for drinking 2025-2035+). 6x75cl 240.00

Domaine Françoise & Denis Clair, Santenay

The late Denis Clair made the reputation of this Domaine thanks to his formidable red-wine-making skills. The arrival of his talented son Jean-Baptiste, with his commitment to take the whites up to the level of the reds, has meant that the Domaine has now become pre-eminent also for its range of Saint-Aubins. It is worth stocking up on whites here in 2020, as frost wreaked havoc on the crop in 2021, and there will be little to offer, next year.

Bourgogne Hautes Côtes de Beaune Blanc

Domaine Françoise & Denis Clair 2020

This comes from vines at the southern end of the Côte de Beaune, near Dezize-lès-Maranges. The grapes were picked early on 25th August, to lock in their freshness. Pale, lemon-gold in colour, this has fine, fruity aromas, with lively, intense Chardonnay length (for drinking 2022-2024+).

Saint-Aubin 1er Cru Les Murgers des Dents de Chien

Domaine Françoise & Denis Clair 2020

A "murger" is a pile of stones that a vigneron creates when clearing a patch of land in order to plant it. This is a strenuous task, made more disagreeable when the stones are as sharp as a dog's teeth, as experienced here. This is one of the village's top Premier Cru sites, lying close to the Montrachet hillside. It is thanks to plantation of sites such as this, by the Clair family and other growers, that Saint-Aubin has progressed so much in recent years. One very old vine-block, aged 80 years, has other vineyards beside it, aged 20 and 35 years. All benefit from excellent exposure to the sun, gentle breezes and free-draining soils. Colour is medium-deep lemon-gold, aromas ripe and rich, palate broadly built, with opulent aftertaste (for drinking 2022-2027+).

Domaine Françoise & Denis Clair 2020

Jean-Baptiste Clair tells the story: "My father bought this part of the mountain at auction in 1994 – when it was thorn-trees, box-bushes, pebbles and scrubland. But it was a good idea – land was not so expensive as it is today. It was planted in 1996, the first harvest being 1999". It is less than 1/5 of a hectare, sometimes giving four barrels, but in 2020, just three. Pale, green-golden in colour, with abundantly fruity, ripe aromas, this is rich, fresh and long (for drinking 2022-2028+).

Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru La Garenne

Domaine Françoise & Denis Clair 2020

We cannot get enough of these delicious white Burgundies grown high on the First Growth hillsides between Meursault and Puligny-Montrachet. Bunches come to perfect ripeness, while acidities can be retained, as grapes do not get over-ripened or scorched (as may happen further down towards the foot of the slopes). This wine comes from the top limit of the Garenne vineyard, near the trees, where breezes kept the bunches cool during moments of high heat during 2020. Colour is pale, lemon-gold, aromas are fresh, infused with citrus, palate has structure and fruit richness with superbly complex length (for drinking 2022-2028+).

Bourgogne Hautes Côtes de Beaune Rouge

Domaine Françoise & Denis Clair 2020 This is a great value Burgundian Pinot Noir, made from a blend of grapes from two areas – 35% from above Saint-Aubin, the balance from near the littleknown First Growth called Les Maranges, to the south of Santenay. The vines are really fine Pinots, producing small berries with thick skins – and half the plantings are old vines. Colour is very deep purple, nose shows luscious fruit. Palate is richly built, with remarkable fruit density for a regional wine, and lively finish (outstanding value, for drinking 2022-2024+).



Santenay Clos Genet

Domaine Françoise & Denis Clair 2020 This is not a First Growth, but represents Santenay's appealing fruitiness, at a reasonable price, with engaging stylishness. It is a success almost every vintage, and time has shown it ages well. The vines lie up-slope from the Clair Domaine, downhill from First Growth La Maladière. Colour is very deep, rubypurple, aromas show pure fruit, with fresh ripeness. Palate is richly structured, with good middle, gentle tannins, refreshing aftertaste (for drinking 2023-2027+).

Domaine Boris Champy, Nantoux

Last year, we were thrilled to introduce, for the first time in the UK, the wines of the highly talented Boris Champy, who has recently taken over running a top estate in the Hautes Côtes de Beaune. These vineyards were originally assembled and brought to prominence by Didier Montchovet, who was a pioneer of organic and bio-dynamic viticulture, dating back to 1984. Didier had reached retirement age, so handed over to Boris, an oenologist by training, with an impressive wine-making record. He previously worked in Libourne for the Moueix family, in Napa at Dominus estate, then for a Beaune shipper, then as manager for Domaine du Clos des Lambrays, in Morey-Saint-Denis.

His vineyards today are situated in the hills westwards of Pommard, with others in the adjoining commune of Bouze-lès-Beaune. Due to the higher altitude of the vines, grapes typically come to ripeness a week or so later here than on the Côte de Beaune. This used to be a disadvantage, but with the hotter summers Burgundy is now regularly experiencing, it allows precious acidity to be retained, while simultaneously natural sugars and grape-skins can be brought to complete ripeness.

Domaine Boris Champy 2020

This comes from a high altitude vineyard in Nantoux, situated at around 420 metres. The vines were planted by the visionary Didier Montchovet back in 1987, by which time his estate was certified bio-dynamic. Pale golden in colour, this has ripe, lemony fruitiness on the nose, with impressive intensity on the palate, good middle and fresh length. 70% of the cuvée fermented in mature, small oak barrels, the balance in an egg-shaped stainless steel sphere (for drinking 2022-2025+).



Bourgogne Hautes Côtes de Beaune Blanc "Montagne 382" Domaine Boris Champy 2020

This comes from a 4-hectare plot (altitude 382 metres), the Montagne de Cras, made up of 3 hectares of vines, and one hectare with great bio-diversity: scree slopes, hedges, orchards, limestone grasslands with numerous orchids and rare trees – a haven for insects and birds. The wine was made and aged in 15% new barrels, with 35% of 1-year barrels, and older – all being assembled prior to bottling. It is bright, lemon-gold, with strikingly ripe aromas. All grapes are hand-picked, then 50% whole clusters went into the vat, to bring perfume and succulent texture. 12-month ageing has taken place in 500-litre barrels. Colour is bright purple of medium depth, aromas are fresh, ripe and open. This is full-bodied, with good structure, brightly fruity, with fine balance and lively aftertaste (for drinking 2022-2025+).

Bourgogne Hautes Côtes de Beaune Rouge "Le Clou 377" *Domaine Boris Champy 2020*

From the opposite side of the narrow valley which leads into the hills above Nantoux, at slightly lower altitude (377 metres), this is Boris's other, superb red wine plot in the Hautes Côtes, known as "Le Clou". The soil here is whiter, with high marlstone content, and plentiful pebbles. The grapes were handpicked, then 70% whole clusters were added to the fermentation vat, to bring concentration and fresh spiciness. The wine has been ageing in small, 228-litre oak barrels. Colour is purple of medium depth, aromas are intense and rich. Palate shows a vivacious core of dense fruitiness, with velvety texture and harmonious aftertaste (for drinking 2023-2026+).

Domaine Blain-Gagnard, Chassagne-Montrachet

With vineyards on many of Chassagne-Montrachet's greatest, most famous hillsides, Jean-Marc and Claudine Blain's Domaine is one of Burgundy's finest white wine estates. In addition, their reds are consistently stand-outs for delicious, fairly-priced red Burgundy.

Minimal intervention is key to the Blain-Gagnard wine-making style. New oak barrels are used imperceptibly – being subtly spread amongst the different cuvées so that oakiness is never noticed. White wines are consistently bottled after no more than 11- or 12-months' barrel-ageing, ensuring that maximum freshness is retained. The finished wines have purity, with impressive fruit richness and harmonious length, while accurately evoking their origins. "We are back to a more classical Burgundy style with these 2020s, compared with the warmer 2018s and 2019s," comments Jean-Marc Blain. "Harvest was the earliest ever at the Domaine, starting on 21st August, with everything in by 26th August. Grapes were perfectly ripe and had a high, natural concentration of acidity, which explains the great freshness this year."

Chassagne-Montrachet blanc *Domaine Blain-Gagnard* 2020

This is once again an exceptional village Chassagne, with 30% of the grapes coming from Premier Cru vineyards: Grande Montagne, with some Champs Gains. These grapes are judiciously blended with those coming from village level sites to produce a wine of outstanding richness, balance and length. Bottled in August 2021, this is pale golden-green, with delicately scented, ripe, citrus aromas. Chassagne-Montrachet 1er Cru Clos Saint Jean

Domaine Blain-Gagnard 2020

This vineyard has deep, clay-limestone soils giving a style of Chassagne that is the fleshiest of the Blain-Gagnard's Premier Crus. The Blains do very little lees-rousing here, so as not to make the wine too round, allowing it to retain vibrancy alongside its natural richness. Pale gold colour with a beautiful, aromatic scent, the palate is full, generous and richly concentrated. Chassagne-Montrachet 1er Cru Caillerets

Domaine Blain-Gagnard 2020

This vineyard is situated at the heart of the slope, just south of the village. Blain-Gagnard's holdings are in two plots, running from the bottom to the top of the site, giving an intricate wine of great complexity. Partly the soils are white, with many pebbles; then higher up, they are marly, with fossil shells. In 2020 this is pale lemon colour, having an intense, lively, lemon-floral aroma. Domaine Marc-Antonin Blain, Chassagne-Montrachet

Marc-Antonin's tiny Domaine goes from strength to strength. After wine studies in Beaune, he worked vintages at Giaconda and Cullen in Australia, then Carrick in New Zealand. He now makes wines from vineyards previously tended by his late grandfather, Jacques Gagnard-Delagrange. Marc-Antonin's cellar is colder than that of his Blain-Gagnard parents, and his wines often spend extra months in barrel before bottling, so their complexities are different. He is one of the most modest, but also talented, members of the emerging generation of Burgundy growers – but productions and our allocations are tiny.

These grapes come from a single plot named Les Voillenots, planted in 1976 by his grandfather. The old vine-roots penetrate deep down into fissures in the limestone bed-rock, bringing exhilarating character. "The balance of natural sugars and acidity was excellent in 2020," Marc-Antonin told us, "but the wines needed to be nourished, so I stirred the lees every two or three weeks, through to the Spring." Colour is green-golden, aromas ripe, open and fine. Palate is richly built, with excellent fruit concentration (for drinking 2022-2026+).

Chassagne-Montrachet Blanc 1er Cru Morgeot

Grapes were 100% destemmed, then natural yeasts transformed the sugars, after 4-5 days of cool, pre-fermentation maceration, into a wine of intense, ruby-purple colour, with open, fresh aromas. Chassagne-Montrachet Rouge 1er Cru Morgeot

Olivier Leflaive 'Récolte du Domaine', Puligny-Montrachet

We are thrilled to be again offering these rare treasures from Patrick and Olivier Leflaive's 'Récolte du Domaine.' This is their 10th vintage from vineyards they own, which were previously part of the family's Domaine Leflaive.

"With rainfall around 50% down on norms from April to August, and 20% more sunshine than in a normal year, we knew this would be a race against hyperconcentration," winemaker Frank Grux told us. He went on: "Picking took place between 21st and 31st August, with naturally high sugars, but without going beyond 13.5 degrees – giving fruit and lemony-limestone character with a little bit of vigour..."

These vineyards are all either bio-dynamically or organically cultivated. With the exception of the Meursault and Chassagne-Montrachet, which were more recently replanted, the vines all date from the 1950s and 1960s. Old vines naturally give low yields, and these wines are some of the most concentrated, intense and thrillingly harmonious of all white Burgundies we know. There is a particular grace, depth of flavour, silky texture and astonishing length in this range that makes the heart skip a beat.

Meursault 1er Cru Blagny "Sous le Dos d'Ane"

Olivier Leflaive "Récolte du Domaine" 2020

These vines lie in a sun-catching amphitheatre adjoining Meursault 1er Cru Les Perrières. When you climb the slope, you can understand why the vineyard is named "under the donkey's back", as the vines are sheltered to the north by a huge, long hummock of stones and trees which resemble the slumbering animal. 25% of new barrels were again chosen for this wine's ageing, and their presence is imperceptible, so well have all elements now come together. Colour is bright, green-gold, aromas complex, ripe and spicy. Palate shows broad attack, with lovely, well-rounded follow-through and splendid, succulent finish (for drinking 2022-2028+).

Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru Folatières Olivier Leflaive "Récolte du Domaine" 2020

Les Folatières is the largest First Growth in Puligny, with several sub-sections. This wine comes from one of the best situated, Peux-Bois, next to "en la Richarde", planted in 1983. It lies on the same contour as the Grand Cru Chevalier-Montrachet, which is just to its south. One third new barrels contributed to this wine's smooth maturation in oak, which lasted until September 2021 (after which the barrels were assembled, in a small vat).

Bâtard-Montrachet Grand Cru

Olivier Leflaive "Récolte du Domaine" 2020

This wine comes entirely from the Puligny-Montrachet side of the Grand Cru, from vines which were planted in 1962 (so are now nearly 60 years old). The parcel is perfectly positioned in the Bâtard-Montrachet "shoulder" – the plot lying between Bienvenues-Bâtard-Montrachet and the great Le Montrachet itself. As in Clos-Vougeot, the top section plots are the best. To preserve freshness, like others in the range this wine was racked in September 2021, in preparation for its assembly in vat, prior to bottling. Colour is pale, lemon-golden, aromas fresh and clean, yet discreet. This is a muscular wine, which needed little lees-rousing to bring texture and creaminess - these were to be tasted from the outset, naturally. Etienne Sauzet, Puligny-Montrachet

Subtle changes have taken place at Etienne Sauzet, since Gérard Boudot's daughter Emilie and her husband Benoît Riffault became increasingly responsible for day-to-day activities. Benoît grew up on his family wine domaine in Sancerre, but his boots today are 100% caked with the soils of Puligny-Montrachet. Etienne Sauzet's wines have been biodynamically cultivated since 2009, which has resulted in lessening yields, with aromas which are purer and more precise. The estate has ECOCERT organic certification, and many of the vineyards are 70 years old, Benoît told us. This is another superb vintage here, and we warmly recommend that you let us know your wishes as soon as possible, as our allocations cover a wide range of great wines, but volumes are modest.

2015 was the first vintage of this wine, Domaine Sauzet having bought 5 hectares of land to the west of Puligny-Montrachet, near La Rochepot and Nolay, in a little valley called Le Boût du Monde. It's one of Burgundy's isolated mini-gorges, celebrated for rare birds and great walks. Young shoots of Chardonnay were grafted onto the lopped-off, existing vines there - to benefit from their deeply-penetrating, established roots. Green-golden in colour, with freshly open aromas recalling orange and pineapple, this is a rich wine with dry finish and fine length (for drinking 2022-2025).

This comes from a half-moon of twelve plots around the village, with the vines called Les Meix, just uphill from Domaine Sauzet, representing about 30% of the cuvée. Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru Les Combettes

Les Combettes is always on very tight allocation, with 70% of the production coming from 60+ year-old vines, whose small berries give a limited, intensely flavoured production. The balance of the vineyard is also now mature, dating from 25 years ago. The vines are planted on terraces bordering the commune boundary with Meursault, just south of that appellation's Meursault-Charmes-dessus. Colour is pale, lemon-golden, aromas are ripe and fine, as yet discreet. Palate shows compact, intense fruitiness, broad, creamy flavours and harmonious, spectacular length (for drinking 2023-2030+). Bienvenues-Bâtard-Montrachet Grand Cru

This is white Burgundy of particular beauty – less powerful than its neighbour Bâtard-Montrachet, but with exceptional richness and complexity. When tasted in October, the wine was still gaining complexity in barrel – two barrels plus a half, none being new oak. The vines were planted in 1936, still going strong. Colour is bright green-golden, aromas are fragrant and already lovely. The palate has natural balance, creamy texture, mouth-wateringly fresh flavours, gorgeous length (for drinking 2023-2030+).

Bâtard-Montrachet Grand Cru

Sauzet's vines are located on the Puligny-Montrachet side of this Grand Cru, which straddles both Puligny and Chassagne. They lie within the Bâtard "shoulder" – that section of the vineyard between Bienvenues and Le Montrachet. Here red marls in the soil contribute intense richness, and luscious texture, such as few Bâtards can boast. Sauzet's rendition is one of the most highly sought-after, brilliant examples of the wine, and this vintage is a classic: green-gold in colour, with richly complex, open aromas of great beauty. Palate shows perfect harmony between fine, compact structure, solid, tense fruitiness and refreshing, energetic aftertaste. This is a superb, well-rounded wine with great length (for drinking 2023-2030+).

Chevalier-Montrachet Grand Cru

As in past years, we shall have to allocate this stellar wine very tightly indeed. The soils are chalky and powdery, Sauzet's vines being located on white marl terraces, right at the top of the vineyard. Consistently, this wine has fragrant aromatics, with mineral nuances. Domaine Chapelle de Blagny, Blagny

These vineyards belonged to the Cistercian Abbey of Maizières, from the 12th to 18th centuries. In 1811 they were bought by an ancestor of Etienne de Brechard, the present owner. For 5 generations the family discreetly tended the vines, harvested the grapes – and sold them, until recently, to local merchants. We were the first to discover domaine-bottlings from this exciting estate, and introduce them - new to the UK - with the 2015 vintage. The property is named after a 15th century chapel, next to the winery.

The First Growth vineyards in the hamlet of Meursault-Blagny may be less wellknown than First Growths like Perrières, Genevrières or Charmes, but quality-wise they are up there with the greatest. With global warming, they are becoming more and more desirable each year, as their altitude protects them from the most torrid heat, allowing precious, natural acidities to be maintained. They lie on high, steep slopes straddling the communes of

Meursault and Puligny-Montrachet. This is classic white wine land, with clay-limestone marls. Domaine Chapelle de Blagny currently cultivates 6 hectares of vines, all concentrated in this zone.

Research is on-going here to identify the best cooper from whom to source the Domaine's new barrel purchases. The recently established artisan barrel-maker Eric Millard's output is proving superb. Oak staves are aged in the open air for three years (this is not unusual, and may be found at several cooperages) but Millard's staves are extra thick, and allowed to heat up gently for three hours over the flames which enable them to be curved. The unfinished barrel is then covered, and allowed to return to normal temperature over 24 hours. So the toast goes deeply into the wood, and is very light, giving the subtlest results.

Domaine Yvon Clerget, Volnay

2015 was the first vintage of the highly talented young winemaker Thibaud Clerget, who completed his studies at Beaune's Lycée Viticole in 2012. He then did vintages with Pinot Noir specialists in New Zealand and Oregon, and on the Côte de Nuits. His family has owned vineyards and made wine in and around Pommard and Volnay since AD 1268, Thibaud being the 28th generation.

If you have rarely encountered bottles from the Domaine, which carries his father's name, this is because since 2010 Yvon Clerget had been selling his grapes, rather than making and bottling his wines. For the 2015 vintage, Thibaud took on the family responsibilities, and all grapes were vinified at the Domaine. We were the first to discover and ship his wines to any export market. Showing his wines at our London Burgundy tasting in January 2017 marked the international launch of this newly thrilling Domaine. Today, his wines are available in 28 countries, so he has told us.

Thibaud made a brilliant success of his first five vintages, and many wines sold out rapidly. We are delighted now to be offering his 6th, which is every bit as enthralling as the first five. Quantities are very limited, with production, as in 2019, at only half the levels of 2017 and 2018.

The latter's philosophies still drive the methods, however. As Thierry used to say: "I want to keep my terroirs healthy. I love the delicacy and the elegance, the distinctive Pinot, and above all, the fun!" Domaine Seguin-Manuel, Beaune

Seguin-Manuel was founded in 1824, however its links with Burgundy vineyards date back as far as 1720. Recently, the business was bought by Thibaut Marion, from an old Beaune family. We first tasted his wines when the firm was still based in Savigny, in a 14th century vat-house with splendid, vaulted cellars which had been built by the Abbey of Cîteaux. On the outside wall could be seen one of the Latin inscriptions for which Savigny is famous: "If my memory serves me right, there are five reasons for drinking: the arrival of a guest, present and future thirst, the quality of the wines and any other reason you like – 1772."

Thibaut's estate covers 5 hectares, and he fine-tuned the wine-making when he moved to a new winery in Beaune. 2020 is the 11th vintage when we have made careful choices, this year finding 8 wines, including 2 whites, from the nearly 30 appellations they make. Thibaut's drive for increased quality and focus has again brought magnificent results, and these wines remain superb value.

Beaune 1er Cru Bressandes Domaine Seguin-Manuel 2020

Like the last two years, this is a particular success, and we are delighted to list it again. It comes from vines which are more than 50 years old, previously owned by Thibaut's uncle François Marion, who passed away in 2019. It takes plenty of sunshine, as in 2020, to bring grapes from this vineyard to perfect ripeness, as the vines lie high up on Beaune's 1st Growth slope. One third whole clusters were retained for fermentation. Colour is purple-ruby of medium depth, aromas are delicate, fine and perfumed. 

Domaine Pavelot, Pernand-Vergelesses

There have been Pavelots tending vines in Pernand since the 17th century, so village records tell us. Today, the 9.5 hectare estate is run by sister and brother Lise & Luc Pavelot, following in the footsteps of father Régis and grandfather Maurice. Most of their vines are in their home village of Pernand-Vergelesses, where they make magnificent First Growths, both white and red, as well as brilliant Corton-Charlemagne, not to mention cutting edge regional, and village level, bottlings.

The Domaine has been certified organic since 2009, but no chemical weed-killers had been used for many years, prior to that. The soils are tilled by plough, and manually, with occasional, green covercrops, and green-harvesting of grapes, if necessary. Organic composts are the only fertiliser.

Harvesting is by hand, and this is one of the few Domaines in Burgundy where the grapes are gently carried in traditional,

wicker shoulder-baskets down the rows. The philosophy of the Domaine may be summarised as a constant reflection on how to ensure the health of their soils - and hence their vines and wines - with respect for the plant and human environment.

We have been importing their bottled wines since the 2015 vintage. We are also thrilled to offer a wide range of their wines En Primeur. The wines have succulent fruit, with structure, freshness and the gentlest of tannins, for the reds. The whites show beautiful harmony. Both colours represent superb value, some for early drinking, some for mid-term ageing.

Pernand-Vergelesses Blanc Domaine Pavelot 2020

The grapes came from several hillside plots around the village, principally Belles Filles and La Morand, with some from Les Quartiers and Sur Herbeux. The wine was 75% vinified in small oak barrels (of which 20% were new) with the balance being made and aged in stainless steel. It was bottled in September 2021. Caradeux is a steep, east-facing First Growth, lying to your right, just outside the village of Pernand-Vergelesses, as you take the road to Beaune. The Pavelot vines have now reached 12 and 13 years of age, and are giving concentrated, rich wine of great beauty and consistency, year on year. It you do not know this vineyard, we urge you to try it. This has been ageing in 40% new oak barrels, and was bottled in September 2021. Colour is greengolden, aromas are fragrant, rich and fresh. Palate is full-bodied, showing impressive fruit density, fleshy texture and lively length (for drinking 2022-2026+).



Pernand-Verglesses Blanc 1er Cru Sous Frétille Domaine Pavelot 2020

The Sous Frétille vineyard is also steeply-sloping, but in this case facing due south. The vines are above the village and its colourful church spire, visible to all who approach. Pebble-rich soils are shallow, yields never plentiful. One third of the Pavelot vines are 80 years old, the average age of the whole plot being around 50 years. The wine aged in oak barrels (40% of which were new) for a year, and will be bottled between New Year and the Spring "to allow it to take on weight and mineral tension" as Luc Pavelot says. Colour is pale golden, aromas are fine though presently discreet, palate is intense with fruitiness, very clean, very precise. Extra time before bottling will see it take on breadth and weight (for drinking 2023-2028+).

Corton-Charlemagne Grand Cru

The Pavelot family owns vines in 4 different sectors of this famous Grand Cru, holding back for Domaine-bottling only the produce of the finest plots. Bourgogne Rouge

Domaine Pavelot 2020 This comes from a hillside vineyard called La Grande Corvée de Bully, was 100% destemmed, then vinified and half aged in cement tank, half in wood, prior to bottling in September 2021, to maximise its fruitiness. Colour is pale ruby, nose is open, perfumed, and fresh. Palate shows bright, lively fruit, refreshing for youthful enjoyment (for drinking 2022-2023+).

Pernand-Vergelesses Rouge Domaine Pavelot 2020

The grapes for this cuvée came from several vineyards which encircle Pernand: Les Bouttières, Les Noirets, Belles Filles and Les Pins. 75% of this wine comes from vines averaging 60 years of age, from the same, steep-sloping, east-facing First Growth which is equally magnificent for Chardonnays (see above). 25% of the Pinot grapes came from a 5-year old vineyard, which brought welcome vibrancy in a hot vintage. Before global warming, this site sometimes struggled to mature its Pinots, as cool air can flow down the valley past it, which used to delay the ripening. There was no fear of that in 2020. Domaine Jean-Baptiste Boudier, Pernand-Vergelesses

Jean-Baptiste Boudier's training took him from Beaune's viticultural school to New Zealand and Roussillon, with 2 years oenology in Bordeaux, including 6 months at Château Haut-Brion. He doesn't believe in pre-fermentation maceration. "I prefer that fermentations start fast," he says. "For my father, colour was very important, but for me, it's not the major factor. Tannins are more important, and we adapt the extractions according to the year, and by tasting." In his avoidance of a pre-fermentation coldsoaking of his grapes, his wine-making is not Burgundian mainstream, but has been carefully thought through, from his own experiences. 2020 is another lovely vintage at the Domaine, with quality and value both outstanding.

Domaine Jean-Baptiste Boudier 2020 Grapes from three different plots in Pernand's two side valleys were brought together to make this cuvée. Colour is pale lemon-gold, aromas are bright and fresh, palate is rich and

It's my only regional wine, I'm always happy here." The vines are to be found near the village of Ladoix-Serrigny, at the foot of the Corton hill. More than 20% whole clusters went into this cuvée, which has been ageing, for just under a year, in barrels which had previously held one or more vintages. Colour is vibrant, mid-deep purple, aromas recall red berry fruitiness, palate is a rich mouthful, smooth and fresh (for drinking 2022-2025+).



Pernand-Vergelesses Rouge 1er Cru Les Fichots *Domaine Jean-Baptiste Boudier 2020*

These vines were planted in 1955, so are more than 60 years old. The plot lies downhill from the village, below the road to Beaune, on the slope beneath First Growth Les Caradeux. "Global warming is good for Les Fichots," says Boudier, "as now we can have very good maturity of the grapes, while keeping a lot of freshness, thanks to deep soils, and no stress from lack of water." Domaine Decelle & Fils, Nuits-Saint-Georges

Here, 85% of the wines come from their own Domaine, which now covers 7 hectares, mainly in the northern Côte de Beaune. We have championed winemaker Jean Lupatelli's work here over the last 7 vintages, and wish him well in his new post as winemaker at Domaine Comte Georges de Vogüé. His philosophy has again guided the style of this 2020 vintage at Decelle & Fils, for which he was responsible until Spring 2021: "harvest with our own team; be very careful on the picking dates; retain whole berries where possible; intervene at a minimum; be delicate with extractions. Our aim is to avoid masking fruitiness with new oak aromas, while renewing our barrel-stocks over 3-4 years. We let the wines run by gravity into barrels – where there may be 50% new oak, for a famous appellation, and 20-30%, or less, for others. As soon as we acquired vineyard plots, we converted them to organic cultivation, now certified by Ecocert. All picking is by hand, and only native yeasts are used."

Domaine Faiveley, Nuits-Saint-Georges

Our shipments from this superb source of great Burgundies date back over 30 years, to the 1989 vintage. This is very much a family business, with François Faiveley's children, Erwan and Eve, now at the helm. Winemaker Jérôme Flous and his assistant Bastien Giraud are highly talented, and operate within a rebuilt, spacious, state-of-the-art winery in Nuits-Saint-Georges. The superb 125 hectare Domaine includes 13 different Grands Crus and 25 Premiers Crus.

Since the 2007 vintage, many carefully thought-through changes have taken place, with work in vineyards and wine-making becoming more closely integrated. They invested in gentler means of transporting grapes from sorting tables to vats, up-graded their temperature control systems, installed a new hydraulic press, and fine-tuned the barrel buying - all to great effect. Jérôme Flous has been here for more than a decade, having previously worked as technical consultant for many top Domaines. The wines have been gaining in richness, fruit density, complexity and smoothness, without sacrifice of ageing potential. The family has been able to take back various vineyards, including this one, for cultivation by the Domaine, which had previously been looked after by a crop-sharer. The half-share of grapes at harvest time which previously went to the vigneron, in payment for his year's work, now come into the Domaine cellars. This means that a separate cuvée of Vosne-Romanée has been made, from a 50-year-old plot of land (with a few younger, infill vines) directly in front of the family's home in Vosne-Romanée, called La Colombière. Domaine Georges Mugneret-Gibourg 2020 From the northern slopes of Nuits-Saint-Georges, where the hillside runs along towards Vosne-Romanée's greatest plots, this steeply-sloped First Growth produces outstanding wines. Vines are nearly 60 years old, and the wine has been ageing in approx. 50% new oak barrels. Prior to 2014, the vines were rented out to a share-cropper, who kept half the production as payment. Now the family cultivates the whole plot, and has been able to bring about cultivation improvements. The wine is one of our favourites in the cellar, and never disappoints. One of the deepest wines of the vintage here, this had well-ripened but discreet aromas, when tasted in October. Echézeaux Grand Cru Domaine Georges Mugneret-Gibourg 2020

This is an assemblage of two sectors of the Echézeaux vineyard – 25% from Les Quartiers de Nuits, which lies just over the wall from Clos-Vougeot, and the balance from Les Rouges du Bas, higher on the hillside. The first plot has vines whose average age is 50 years, the second, more than 60 years. More than 20% whole clusters were included (unusually at this estate), and the wine has been ageing in 60% new oak barrels. Some whole clusters were first retained for Echézeaux in 2016, when there were so few grapes (after a frost) that it was evidently sensible to retain some whole bunches, to help halffill the vat. Domaine J-F Mugnier, Chambolle-Musigny

Nuits-Saint-Georges Clos de la Maréchale has been owned solely by the Mugnier family for generations, but the vineyard was for many years let out for cultivation elsewhere. In 2004, Frédéric succeeded in claiming it back. He built a new winery beside his home, and the wine has gone from strength to strength ever since.

"I like the reliable consistency of Clos de la Maréchale," says Mugnier. "Musigny is great, Amoureuses is exciting, but Maréchale is my favourite vineyard." On wine-making, Mugnier explains: "All my wines are made in exactly the same way - fermentation, use of wood, time in barrel. Any difference must come from the place, the age of vines, the location. It's not like creating a perfume, each wine must be the expression of something that comes from nature." Concerning the 2020 vintage, the news here is that the harvest started on 26th August, and was finished by the 31st. "There was nothing to sort, and very small quantities as well, so it was so easy..."

Domaine Henri Magnien, Gevrey-Chambertin

This small Domaine has extraordinary vineyard-holdings on the Côte Saint-Jacques. This is a hillside of Gevrey-Chambertin First Growths, above the village, which narrowly missed classification as Grands Crus, in the 1930s. Clients with long memories will recall that we shipped wines from this estate in the mid-1980s – when Henri, the grandfather of Charles Magnien, who now runs the estate, was in charge.

Since taking over the reins, Charles has been determinedly bringing it back up to the level which made his grand-father's wines exceptional. Charles makes a point of preserving and propagating the "Pinot Noir Magnien" (about which, see below). Working closely with his cooper, he has developed his own, lightly-fired but long-time-toasted oak barrels, with the object of eliminating the vanilla or coffee aromas which may come with heavier toasting. "I search to produce fine wine, not tannic wine – wine you can drink young, and keep if you want," says Charles. He is a new star in Gevrey-Chambertin, whose wines we were the first to re-introduce to UK Burgundy-lovers. We are thrilled to offer them again.

Maison Laroze de Drouhin, Gevrey-Chambertin

Laroze de Drouhin is the négociant arm of Domaine Drouhin-Laroze, which was set up in 2008, by Caroline Drouhin. It has enabled the family to supplement their supply of grapes, increasing their range of wines and appellations. This long-established Domaine has magnificent vineyard-holdings in the northern Côte de Nuits, with many First Growths, and also no less than six of the greatest Grands Crus. The three First Growths we have chosen to list this year -Au Closeau, Clos Prieur and Lavaut Saint Jacques - are outstanding, and so too are Latricières-Chambertin, Clos-Vougeot, Bonnes Mares, and Chambertin Clos de Bèze. The Musigny is amazing (though our allocation is minuscule). The barrels age in perfect conditions of humidity and temperature in underground, two-storied cellars which date back to construction after Waterloo, around 1825.

Many subtle improvements were introduced here as Philippe Drouhin took over from his father Bernard. Now we are witnessing a second generational change, as Philippe and his wife Christine encourage their well-qualified children Nicolas and Caroline to take over the reins.

In the past, all grape-bunches were de-stemmed, but now different proportions of whole clusters are being added to certain Cuvées (details are below). From village-level offerings up to the rarest Grands Crus, these wines offer superb quality and are great value for money, across the range.

Gevrey-Chambertin Dix Climats

Domaine Drouhin-Laroze 2020

The Domaine owns 4 hectares of village-level Gevrey-Chambertin, from which they regularly make one of the most impressive examples of the appellation. 30% whole bunches went into the fermenting vat for this wine, and it has been ageing in 40% new oak barrels. Colour is vibrant, ruby-purple, aromas are ripe and meaty, palate is full-bodied and round, with attractively soft, fresh finish (for drinking 2023-2029+).

Gevrey-Chambertin 1er Cru Clos Prieur

Domaine Drouhin-Laroze 2020

This vineyard lies just south of Au Closeau, and also neighbours Grand Cru Mazis-Chambertin, which is just across the Route des Grands Crus. It is always one of the most delicate and elegant of the village's First Growths. Colour is medium deep, aromas clean, ripe and fresh. Palate has full structure, with intensely mineral drive, finishing with well-rounded, rich, smooth tannins, very harmonious (for drinking 2024-2032+).

Gevrey-Chambertin 1er Cru Lavaut Saint Jacques

Domaine Drouhin-Laroze 2020

This vineyard is one of the highest Premiers Crus of the commune, and always one of the last to be harvested. The soils are thin and pebble-rich, giving wines of intense fruit, which can be dense when youthful, even initially a bit austere - but they mature superbly. For this 2020, all stems were removed before fermentation. Colour is red-purple of medium depth, aromas show warm, well-ripened fruitiness. Palate is richly intense, silkily textured, with ripe tannins which need a couple of years in bottle to soften (for drinking 2025-2032+).

Latricières-Chambertin Grand Cru

Domaine Drouhin-Laroze 2020

Latricières-Chambertin lies directly south of Le Chambertin, producing one of the longestliving wines in all Burgundy. It is a racy wine, in the same style as the Lavaut Saint Jacques, but with another dimension of structure and fruit depth. Bunches were fully de-stemmed. Colour is impressive, deep purple, aromas are discreet but promise well. Palate is full and fleshy, showing more body than we often find in Latricières, with creamy, admirably long aftertaste (for drinking 2025-2040+).

Clos Vougeot Grand Cru

Domaine Drouhin-Laroze 2020

The Domaine's Clos Vougeot holdings are superbly situated high up in the Clos, behind the Château (Plante l'Abbaye and Quartier Marey Haut), with another large parcel in mid-slope, just over the wall from Grands-Echézeaux. Old vines contribute to ensuring the concentration and length of flavour of this superb wine, whose bunches were 100% de-stemmed. Grapes were super-ripe, giving a deep purple wine with astonishingly fresh aromas. Palate is ebulliently fruity, showing energy, rich tannins, and superb potential (for drinking 2025-2040+).

Bonnes-Mares Grand Cru

Domaine Drouhin-Laroze 2020

Drouhin-Laroze owns an impressive 1.5 hectares of Bonnes-Mares, situated at the heart of the Grand Cru - and the wine is consistently superb. In 2020, 40% of the grapes went into the fermentation vat as whole bunches, contributing aromatic complexity, intricacy of structure and silkiness of texture. "We love what whole bunches bring to Bonnes-Mares," say Caroline and Nicolas. This is rich purple in colour, with strikingly fine fragrances. Palate is fantastic, with broad, rich fruitiness, powerful tannins without dryness, great length and magnificent finish (for drinking 2026-2045+).

The Domaine owns nearly 1.5 hectares here: an enviable vineyard-holding, with vines partly dating back to 1949. This was 100% de-stemmed, giving a wine of medium-deep, purpleruby colour and discreet, yet concentrated aromas. Palate is rich and dense, with latent power, creamy texture and long, soft aftertaste. This is again one of the greatest wines of the vintage, with superb potential to age for two or more decades (for drinking 2026-2050+).

Musigny Grand Cru

Domaine Drouhin-Laroze 2020

The vines here lie high up in the Musigny Grand Cru, close to rows belonging to Comte Georges de Vogüé, Domaine Leroy and Joseph Drouhin. Two new oak barrels contain the 2020 production, in which 30% whole clusters were included. This has beautiful, deep purple colour, with superb aromas, delicate and very fine. Palate shows stunning fruit with freshness, and beautifully balancing acidity with the finest tannins. A wine for long keeping, and also mid-term, thrilling drinking. This is very rare, and one the vintage's greatest bottles (for drinking 2026-2045+).
