The Style of the 2022 Wines & a Note on Prices

There is a thrilling variety of styles in 2022, with varied potentials for early and mid-term drinking, and many great wines for laying down - as may be seen, from our descriptions in the pages that follow. Without doubt, this is an excellent vintage for both reds and whites, a leading characteristic being radiant clarity of fruit. They display the richness, ripeness and charm of a warm, sunny growing season, but also have energy, fine structures and freshness.

Crucially, good volumes were also produced in 2022, bringing a welcome stability to prices. Coming after the greatly reduced harvest that many experienced in 2021, we are delighted to have been able to hold – and also bring down – the prices of most wines across this offer.

The 2022 Growing Season and Harvest

Spring came early to Burgundy vineyards in 2022, but thankfully there was virtually no frost damage in April. The flowering went through well in May, in sunny, dry weather, allowing growers to think about an early harvest. July then broke the records for sunshine, and August continued hot and dry. Fortunately, there had been plentiful rain in mid-late June, and the accumulated water reserves allowed grape maturation to proceed apace during the summer, without the blockages which are to be feared in very dry, hot summers. Young plantations suffered, but mature vineyards thrived. There was no succession of very hot nights, so balance between sugars and acidities could be maintained, while grape-skins and tannins ripened. Picking started in many villages at the end of August, and went through in excellent conditions.

Domaine Daniel Dampt & Fils, Chablis

Daniel Dampt and his sons Vincent and Sébastien make very pure wines, with the crisply dry, long finish of signature Chablis. Oak casks are never used on their First Growths, allowing the individual characters to shine through intensely. The estate was among the first to pick in 2022, beginning on 1st September, to capture natural acidities as well as the rich sugars which had built up during the dry summer. Grapes were very healthy, giving a vintage that is charming and beautiful.

Chablis 1er Cru Les Lys Domaine Daniel Dampt & Fils 2022

This is the oldest block the family owns, the vines being over 60 years old. Located within First Growth Les Vaillons, it has been made separately since 2001, when its individuality and length of flavour were first recognised. The vines are tilted towards the north, allowing good acidities to be maintained. Colour is pale golden, aromas are delicate and floral, palate is intense, rich and fresh (for drinking 2024-2027+).

Chablis 1er Cru Côte de Léchet

Domaine Daniel Dampt & Fils 2022

Located on the hillside leading up from the village of Milly, where Daniel Dampt is based, this Premier Cru consistently gives a wine of exceptional concentration, with the Domaine's greatest ageing potential. Pale lemon-gold in colour, this shows open fruitiness with powerful, dense presence in the mouth and lingering aftertaste (for drinking 2025-2030+).

Chablis 1er Cru Fourchaume

Domaine Daniel Dampt & Fils 2022

Fourchaume is to Chablis what Charmes is to Meursault - often the most ebullient, luscious First Growth, to be enjoyed while youthful. This is pale-coloured, and was bottled in July 2023 to capture its vivacity. Flavours are intense, crisp and long lasting (for drinking 2024-2028+).

Chablis Grand Cru Bougros

Maison Dampt 2022

The Dampt family has been buying pressed juice from this Grand Cru vineyard since 2008. They have fine-tuned the wine-making, partly using a tank, partly oak barrels for the fermentation and ageing. To achieve richly rounded volume in the mouth, while avoiding noticeable oakiness, the juice starts fermenting in tank, then is run into barrels, then back into tank after the secondary fermentation. This was bottled in August 2023, and is bright, green-golden, with ample, fresh aromas. Palate is richly concentrated, round, complex and long (for drinking 2025-2030+).

Domaine Christian Moreau Père & Fils, Chablis

Christian Moreau and his son Fabien's estate is concentrated on the right bank of the river Serein, with terrific Grand Cru holdings, in addition to one of the region's most superb First Growths: Vaillon Cuvée Guy Moreau. These wines all come from Domaine vineyards, except for the Village Chablis, where grapes from 1.5 ha. of estate vineyard are supplemented by fruit from two other plots, from which the Moreau family has been buying for 15 years. "2022 was the hottest year we have ever seen," Fabien told us, "but the nights were fresh, there was no heat-wave, so the vines were not stressed."

Domaine Christian Moreau Père & Fils 2022

These grapes were fermented in tank, and the wine was bottled before the 2023 harvest, to maximise its freshness. Lemon-gold in colour, this is fine and floral, with harmonious, easy-to-love, soft fruitiness and gentle length (for drinking 2024-2026+).

Chablis 1er Cru Vaillon Cuvée Guy Moreau

Domaine Christian Moreau Père & Fils 2022

These vines were 89 years old for this vintage, the plot dating from 1933. "Planted by my grandfather," says Christian "and still in super condition. We are taking cuttings from these vines, for replanting our vineyards in the future." Bright green-golden in colour, this shows richly concentrated fruitiness on both nose and palate. There is volume in the mouth, vivacity on the finish and splendid length (for drinking 2024-2030+).

Chablis Grand Cru Valmur

Domaine Christian Moreau Père & Fils 2022

These vines, planted in 1963, are 60 years old. 80% of the vineyard is in the best sector of Valmur, facing south-east, with the balance facing north-westerly, bringing valuable freshness to the cuvée. Colour is green-lemon, fruitiness is generous, palate is sturdy, round and luscious (for drinking 2025-2032+).

Chablis Grand Cru Vaudésir

Domaine Christian Moreau Père & Fils 2022

This tiny Grand Cru is un-matched for its elegance, fragrance and harmony. Planted in 1998, facing south-east, the roots of the vines have now penetrated deeply into the limestone, bringing impressive complexities. Colour is green-lemon, aromas are fine, palate is rich and silkily-textured, with pure, floral fruitiness (for drinking 2025-2033+).

Chablis Grand Cru Blanchot

Domaine Christian Moreau Père & Fils 2022

The vines are over 30 years old, from a small plot, giving just one and a half barrels this year. It has been ageing in a glass wine globe, to retain its purity and freshness. Green-gold in colour, this is rich and open on the nose. Palate is intense, bright, fine and long (for drinking 2025-2032+).

Chablis Grand Cru Clos

Domaine Christian Moreau Père & Fils 2022

The Domaine owns a magnificent 3 hectare plot of Les Clos, extending all the way up the hill to the trees. Many Chablis-lovers consider this the most classic, greatest Grand Cru of all. Vines are 65 years old in mid-slope, and 55 years old at the top. Green-golden in colour, this has pungent aromatics, with energetic, bright fruitiness, and harmonious, intense length (for drinking 2026-2035+).

Domaine Masse Père & Fils & Famille Masse, Barizey Côte Chalonnaise

A new discovery with the 2021 vintage, this family Domaine is based in a small village over the hill from Givry. They make great-value fine wines both white and red, from the family Domaine and – as Famille Masse - from carefully-sourced, bought-in grapes and juice. Fabrice Masse has help and support from his experienced uncle Roland Masse, who was, for many years, winemaker at the Hospices de Beaune.

Uphill from the 1st Growth Clos Jus, this is the first vineyard of the Givry territory, as one arrives from Mercurey. Lemon-gold in colour, it has clean, attractive aromas, with bright fruitiness and soft, fine length (for drinking 2024-2028+).

Givry Blanc 1er Cru En Choué

Famille Masse 2022

Fermented 100% in small, oak barrels, of which one third were new, these grapes come from a cousin's vineyard, in the hamlet of Russilly, between Givry and Jambles. The vines are old, facing south-east, giving a lemon-gold wine with complex, fresh aromas, rich fruitiness and creamy, fine texture (for drinking 2024-2028+).

Givry Rouge 1er Cru En Choué

Famille Masse 2022

These Pinot Noir grapes come from a 45-year-old vineyard. They were 100% de-stemmed, then held at low temperature for five days, prior to the start of fermentation, to encourage gentle extraction. The wine has aged in small barrels, of which 20% were new. En Choué is one of the last vineyards to be picked each year, as it lies on high terrain in Russilly. Colour is medium deep, ruby purple, aromas tight yet intensely fruity. Palate shows fine freshness, medium body and supple length (for drinking 2024-2028+).

Givry Rouge 1er Cru Champ Lalot

Domaine Masse 2022

Similarly vinified, this wine shows deeper, purple-ruby colour and extra exuberance on the nose. The vines average 35 years of age, and have given a wine which - after ageing in one third new barrels - shows rich structure, solid fruitiness and splendid, fresh length (for drinking 2025-2029+).

Domaine Patrick Guillot, Mercurey

We have been shipping from this family Domaine in Mercurey for nearly a dozen vintages. Patrick Guillot entrusts his wines exclusively to us in the UK, and we are delighted to have them. Located in Chamirey, a hamlet of Mercurey, Guillot's first harvest was 1988, when he had three hectares in production. He and his wife have slowly doubled the size of the Domaine, where all grapes are hand-picked, and where the most conscientious attention to all aspects of viticulture and wine-making result in striking successes. This is one of our favourite sources for superb value bottles, with splendid reds and an excellent, 1st Growth white. "It was very dry here in summer 2022," said Guillot, "but the 100mm rain we had in June saved the harvest."

Mercurey Blanc 1er Cru Les Veley

Domaine Patrick Guillot 2022

A small production here, which was vinified in one new 500-litre barrel, with another which had held a previous harvest, and an older 228-litre barrel. This is pale golden in colour, rich and fresh on the nose, with splendidly ripe creaminess on the palate and good length (for drinking 2024-2028+).

Mercurey Rouge Les Chavances Vieilles Vignes Domaine Patrick Guillot 2022

This wine comes from vines close to the Guillot home, with many dating back to 1980, 1963 and 1955. They have been cordon-pruned, to restrict their yield. The grapes were 100% de-stemmed, giving a wine of lively, bright fruitiness,

well harmonised structure and gentle tannins (for drinking 2024-2028+).

Mercurey Rouge 1er Cru Clos des Montaigu

Domaine Patrick Guillot 2022

This is one of Mercurey's greatest terroirs for red wine, and rightly classified a First Growth. The vineyard was carefully replanted between 1988 and 1999, so the vines are now on average 28 years old. They must have put their roots down deep, for this is superb. Colour is impressive, purple-ruby, aromas are open, ripe and fresh. "This is never aggressive," says Guillot, and we agree. The wine has elegant, super-fine fruit, with richness and balanced, long aftertaste (for drinking 2025-2032+).

Mercurey Rouge 1er Cru 'Les Trois Louves'

Domaine Patrick Guillot 2022

A plot within Clos des Montaigu was planted in 2001 with the little-seen Pinot Noir Clone No. 943. This produces bunches where the grapes hang loose around their stems, giving a wine of exceptional fruit, and the silkiest of tannins. Only 3 barrels were made that year, fermented in a tiny tank, with Guillot's wife and their two daughters all helping - sometimes climbing inside the vat to tread the grapes. Chamirey is a tiny hamlet, whose inhabitants were known as stay-at-homes. They never ventured far afield, like wolves in their dens, whence their nick-name: "Les Loups de Chamirey." In naming this special cuvée Les Trois Louves, Patrick Guillot pays tribute to the 3 she-wolves in his family, without whom this sumptuous wine could not have seen the light of day. Once again, just 3 barrels have been made in 2022, two being new, one having held a previous vintage. The wine is very deep in colour, aromas being ripe, fresh and open. Palate is densely built, with splendid fruit concentration, mouth-coatingly gentle tannins and lovely length (for drinking 2025-2032+).

Domaine Claudie Jobard, Demigny

Burgundian vines and wine-making are part of Claudie Jobard's DNA. Her mother Laurence was for many years the greatly-respected winemaker at Joseph Drouhin, and her family runs a nursery which multiplies vines for replanting top vineyards, throughout Burgundy.

Since 2002 Claudie has been making her own wines in Rully, and from 2011 took over responsibility for additional family vineyards, producing tiny quantities including two Pommards and a Beaune 1er Cru, Les Epenottes. 2022 is the 13th vintage we have shipped, and her wines have become favourites with all who try them. All vineyards are now cultivated organically. Montagny 1er Cru was a new offering in 2019, which we are delighted to offer again, and we are thrilled to see the reappearance of her 1st Growth Rully Les Cloux.

Rully Blanc En Villerange Domaine Claudie Jobard 2022

This comes from a gently sloping, clay-rich vineyard on a hillside on the way to Mercurey. It faces south-east, the ideal exposure for early ripening. Drawing on the family's expertise with vines, it was planted with two, carefully-selected Chardonnay clones. 100% barrel- fermented, this was bottled (without need of fining) in August 2023, to imprison its liveliness. Colour is lemon-gold, aromas are ripe, fine and open, palate shows concentrated attack, good balance, fresh length (for drinking 2024-2028+).

Montagny 1er Cru Madeleine

Domaine Claudie Jobard 2022

Ten barrels were made here (compared with only four, in the frost-affected 2021 vintage); the wine aged in not-new barrels and was bottled in August 2023. The vines average 35 years of age. The wine is lemon-golden, with rich, well-ripened aromas and round, creamy texture on the palate, finishing soft and generous (for drinking 2024-2028+).

Rully Blanc 1er Cru Les Cloux

Domaine Claudie Jobard 2022

This is an east-facing, pebble-rich vineyard located near to 1st Growths Raclot and Rabourcé. It is one of the village's best sites, with vines averaging over 50 years in age. It was entirely fermented in small barrels, with limited lees-rousing during the fermentation, then bottled before the 2023 harvest. Green-golden in colour, the nose is fine yet discreet, the palate being intensely fruity, lively, long and fine (for drinking 2025-2030+).

Bourgogne Côte d'Or Milliane

Domaine Claudie Jobard 2022

Named for Claudie's great-grandmother (Emilie-Anne) this comes partly from a plot uphill from Pommard Les Charmots, and partly from 70+ year-old vines which lie where many of Pommard's best regional Bourgognes are made: opposite the château, not far from the plane-tree-lined RN 74. It was bottled in September 2023, just before the harvest. This is rich, ruby-purple, with bright fruit on the nose and splendid structure, concentration and suppleness. All lovers of Pinot Noir may relish this wine (for drinking 2024-2028+).

PLANS PROM

Beaune 1er Cru Les Epenottes

Domaine Claudie Jobard 2022

These vines (partly 50, partly 60-years-old) are planted on clay-rich soil, downhill from Beaune Clos des Mouches, near Pommard's boundary. They ripen early, and are often the first to be picked at the Domaine. Just three barrels were made this vintage, of which one was new. In colour, ruby-purple, with ample perfume and silky, beautiful fruit on the palate. Tannins are gentle; finish is fresh - this is a wine of immaculate balance and lovely potential (for drinking 2026-2034+).

Pommard 1er Cru Les Charmots

Domaine Claudie Jobard 2022

There are many short rows of vines here, so all vineyard work has to be done by hand, horse, or with a mini-caterpillar. The vines are over 100 years old, and any which die are replaced with shoots grafted from existing vines in the plot, to maintain character and individuality. This wine has ruby colour of medium depth, with fine, well-ripened aromas. Palate is densely fruity, structure is rich without being massive, acidity and tannins are gentle and well-integrated, length and potential are impressive (for drinking 2027-2035+).

Domaine Françoise & Denis Clair, Santenay

The late Denis Clair made the reputation of this Domaine thanks to his formidable red wine-making skills. The arrival of his talented son Jean-Baptiste, with his commitment to take the whites up to the level of the reds, has meant that the Domaine has also now become preeminent for its range of Saint-Aubins. Jean-Baptiste compares his red 2022s to his excellent, finely balanced 2019s, saying that the 2022s do not have the more pronounced, sunny richness of the 2020s (which were more concentrated by drought in August).

Bourgogne Hautes Côtes de Beaune Blanc

Domaine Françoise & Denis Clair 2022

This comes from vines at the southern end of the Côte de Beaune, near Dezize-lès-Maranges. Green-lemon in colour, it is fresh and lively, with well-ripened fruit and attractive, fresh length (for drinking 2024-2026+).

Santenay Blanc

Domaine Françoise & Denis Clair 2022

These vines were planted on mid-slope land now deemed more appropriate for Chardonnay than Pinot Noir (which had previously been grown here). Colour is lemon-golden, aromas are delicately exotic, recalling fresh peaches, palate is full, rich and bright, with fresh length (for early drinking 2024-2027+).

Saint-Aubin 1er Cru Les Frionnes

Domaine Françoise & Denis Clair 2022

This is an outstanding First Growth Saint Aubin, which has been vinified and aged 100% in small oak barrels. The wine is assembled 1/3 from the Perrières part of the vineyard, where the vines are 70-80 years old, with 2/3 from the Frionnes sector (average age 25 years). Pale lemon in colour, it has scented, floral aromas, with intense liveliness on the palate. Vivacity is its hallmark, allied to supple fruitiness (for drinking 2024-2028+).

Saint-Aubin 1er Cru Les Murgers des Dents de Chien

Domaine Françoise & Denis Clair 2022

A "murger" is a pile of stones that a vigneron creates when clearing a patch of land in order to plant it. This is a strenuous task, made more disagreeable when the stones are as sharp as dog's teeth, like here. This is one of the top Premier Cru sites, lying close to the Montrachet hillside. It is thanks to conscientious work on sites such as this, by the Clair family and other growers, that Saint-Aubin has progressed so much in recent years. One very old vine-block, aged 80 years, has other rows beside it, aged 20 and 35 years. All benefit from excellent exposure to the sun, gentle breezes and free-draining soils. Lemon-gold in colour, this is spicy and fresh, with volume in the mouth allied to fruit intensity, the finish being complex and lively (for drinking 2025-2030+).

Saint-Aubin 1er Cru En Remilly

Domaine Françoise & Denis Clair 2022

Jean-Baptiste Clair tells the story: "My father bought this part of the hillside at auction in 1994 – when it was thorn-trees, box-bushes, pebbles and scrubland. It was a good idea – land was not so expensive as it is today. He planted it in 1996, the first harvest being 1999." It is less than 1/5 of a hectare, on a south-west facing slope, and gave four barrels in 2022. Colour is lemon-gold, aromas are pungent and fine, palate is rich, complete, fine and long-lasting (for drinking 2025-2030+).

Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru La Garenne

Domaine Françoise & Denis Clair 2022

We cannot get enough of these delicious white Burgundies grown high on the First Growth hillsides between Meursault and Puligny-Montrachet. Bunches come to perfect ripeness, while acidities can be retained, as grapes do not get over-ripened or scorched (as may happen further down towards the foot of the slopes). This wine comes from the top limit of the Garenne vineyard, near the trees, where breezes kept the bunches cool during moments of high heat during 2022. Colour is lemon-gold, nose is discreet, fine and delicate. Palate is silkily-textured, showing pure fruitiness and lovely, rounded length (for drinking 2025-2030+).

Bourgogne Hautes Côtes de Beaune Rouge

Domaine Françoise & Denis Clair 2022

This is a great value Burgundian Pinot Noir, made from a blend of grapes from two areas – 35% from above Saint-Aubin, the balance from near the little-known First Growth called Les Maranges, to the south of Santenay. The vines are really fine Pinots, producing small berries with thick skins – and half the plantings are old vines. Rich, deep purple in colour, this shows pure, ripe Pinot Noir aromas, powerful fruitiness and supple finish (for drinking 2024-2026).

Santenay Clos Genet

Domaine Françoise & Denis Clair 2022

This is not a First Growth, but represents Santenay's appealing fruitiness at a reasonable price, with engaging stylishness. It is consistently a success, and time has shown it ages well. The vines lie up-slope from the Clair domaine buildings, downhill from First Growth La Maladière. Colour is intense rubypurple, with spicy, fresh aromatics on the nose. There is dense, tight fruitiness on the palate. This needs a year or two in bottle to soften and emerge into smoothness (for drinking 2025-2028+).

Santenay 1er Cru Clos de la Comme

Domaine Françoise & Denis Clair 2022

This vineyard touches the Chassagne-Montrachet First Growth Morgeot, which lies just across the commune border to its north. Although the vines are young, the quality of Pinots chosen for planting, allied to the exceptional nature of the site, results in a wine of great beauty and elegance. Deep ruby-purple in colour, this shows ebullient fruitiness on nose and palate, with vibrant length and a soft finish (for drinking 2025-2030+).

Santenay 1er Cru Clos de Tavannes

Domaine Françoise & Denis Clair 2022

Two-thirds of this vineyard is planted with very old vines (aged 60 years or more), the balance with vines aged 35+. This is once again the most richly structured wine in the Clair cellar more backward than Clos de la Comme. The wine is ageing in small barrels, of which less than 15% were new. Colour is impressively deep, aromas are ripe and roasted, palate is richly structured, densely fruity and complex, with wrap-around tannins and excellent length (for drinking 2026-2035+).

Domaine Blain-Gagnard, Chassagne-Montrachet

With vineyards on many of Chassagne-Montrachet's greatest, most famous hillsides, Jean-Marc and Claudine Blain's domaine is one of Burgundy's finest white wine estates. In addition, their reds are consistently stand-outs for delicious, fairly-priced red Burgundy.

Minimal intervention is key to the Blain-Gagnard wine-making style. New oak barrels are used imperceptibly – being subtly spread amongst the different cuvées so that oakiness is never noticed. White wines are consistently bottled after no more than 11- or 12-months' barrel-ageing, ensuring that maximum freshness is retained. The finished wines have purity, with impressive fruit richness and harmonious length, while accurately evoking their origins.

The range of wines has narrowed here, as their son Marc-Antonin Blain has taken over cultivation and wine-making for several plots (see page 19).

Puligny-Montrachet

Domaine Blain-Gagnard 2022

This comes from vines which are 60 years old, situated at the heart of the slope, just beneath Premier Cru Les Pucelles. The vines lie beside a path up which Puligny's cows used to climb (La Rue aux Vaches) on their way to pasture on the plateau above the woods. The soils are quite different to those in Chassagne – blacker, more humus-rich and marly. Pale, greenlemon in colour, with aromas which are fine and fresh, this shows delicate balance between fruit intensity, silky texture and fresh length (for drinking 2024-2028+).

Chassagne-Montrachet 1er Cru Caillerets

Domaine Blain-Gagnard 2022

This vineyard is situated at the heart of the slope, just south of the village. Blain-Gagnard's holdings are in two plots, running from the bottom to the top of the site, giving an intricate wine of great complexity. Partly the soils are white, with many pebbles; higher up, they are marly, with fossil shells. Pale lemon-green in colour, this shows powerful freshness on the nose. The body is richly structured, tensely wrought and fine, with many flavours swirling round the finish (for drinking 2025-2032+).

Domaine Marc-Antonin Blain, Chassagne-Montrachet

Marc-Antonin's Domaine goes from strength to strength. After wine studies in Beaune, he worked vintages at Giaconda and Cullen in Australia, then Carrick in New Zealand. He now makes wines from vineyards previously tended by his late grandfather, Jacques Gagnard-Delagrange as well as several which have just come across to him from his Blain-Gagnard parents. Marc-Antonin's cellar is colder than that of his parents, and his wines both white and red - spend extra months in barrel, and also in tank before bottling, so their complexities are different. He is one of the most modest, but also talented, members of the emerging generation of Burgundy growers.

Chassagne-Montrachet Blanc Domaine Marc-Antonin Blain 2022

These grapes come from two plots which lie south of the village. 40% is from Les Voillenots, which has deep, clay-rich soil, and was planted in 1976 by Marc-Antonin's grandfather. 60% comes from Les Masures, downhill from 1st Growth Champ Gain, on limestone-rich soils which bring minerality and freshness. Green-golden in colour, with nose and palate which are fine and open, this is rich-bodied, full-flavoured and crisply long (for drinking 2024-2028+).

Chassagne-Montrachet Blanc 1er Cru Clos Saint Jean

Domaine Marc-Antonin Blain 2022

This vineyard has many small pebbles, on deep, clay-limestone soils giving a style of Chassagne that is fleshy rather than steely. We are thrilled to be again offering these rare treasures from Patrick and Olivier Leflaive's 'Récolte du Domaine'. This is their 12th vintage from vineyards they own, which were previously part of the family's Domaine Leflaive. Franck Grux is approaching retirement, so this vintage - his 41st, as a wine-maker - is a transition year, with his chosen successor Solène Panigai having worked alongside him

These vineyards are all either bio-dynamically or organically cultivated. With the exception of the Meursault and Chassagne-Montrachet, which were more recently replanted, the vines all date from the 1950s and 1960s. Old vines naturally give low yields, and these wines are some of the most concentrated, intense and thrillingly harmonious of all white Burgundies. There is a particular grace, depth of flavour, silky texture and astonishing length in this range that lift them to the highest quality levels we know.

Chassagne-Montrachet 1er Cru Clos Saint Marc

Olivier Leflaive 'Récolte du Domaine' 2022

These vines, located within the wider First Growth Les Vergers, were planted in 1992, and have been cultivated organically from the start. Capturing the grapes' natural, racy freshness is of paramount importance to winemaker Franck Grux, and here he has again succeeded superbly. The wine has been ageing in 25% new barrels. Colour is green-golden, aromas show fine fruitiness with spice, palate has layers of flavour, tight fruit with gentle salinity on the finish, and harmonious aftertaste (for drinking 2024-2030+).

These vines lie in a sun-catching amphitheatre adjoining Meursault 1er Cru Les Perrières. Etienne Sauzet, Puligny-Montrachet

Gentle changes took place at Etienne Sauzet, when Gérard Boudot's daughter Emilie and her husband Benoît Riffault took over day-to-day activities at the domaine. Benoît grew up on his family wine domaine in Sancerre, but his boots today are 100% caked with the soils of Puligny-Montrachet. Etienne Sauzet's wines have been bio-dynamically cultivated since 2009, which has resulted in lessening yields, with aromas which are very pure and precise. The estate has organic certification, and many of the vineyards are 70 years old. "2022 was not too complicated," Benoît told us, "with not much pressure to combat vine diseases, and not too much heat. Grapes were perfectly healthy, and have given wines with fruit and balance, fairly easy to understand." This is another superb vintage here, and we warmly recommend that you let us know your wishes as soon as possible, as our allocations cover a wide range of great wines, but volumes are modest.

Etienne Sauzet 2022 6x75cl 144.00

This wine comes mainly from grapes growing on low-lying land in the commune of Puligny-Montrachet, with some from neighbouring Meursault. Racked from barrel into tank in July 2023, this now has bright golden colour, with open, ripe aromas. Palate is vivacious and fruity, with smooth texture and excellent freshness on the finish (for drinking 2024-2027+).

Bourgogne Hautes Côtes de Beaune Blanc Jardin du Calvaire

2015 was the first vintage of this wine, Domaine Sauzet having bought 5 hectares of land to the west of Puligny-Montrachet, near La Rochepot and Nolay, in a little valley called Le Boût du Monde. It is one of Burgundy's isolated mini-gorges, celebrated for rare birds, steep precipices and great walks. Young shoots of Chardonnay were grafted onto the lopped-off, existing vines there - to benefit from their deeply-penetrating, established roots. Pale golden in colour, this had tight aromas, when tasted in October, but the palate was rich and ripe, with fine, fresh finish (for drinking 2024-2026).

These vines lie high on the hill, near to Blagny, so benefit from cool breezes and lower summer temperatures, to ensure that precious natural acidity is retained. In a hot vintage like 2022, this plot comes into its own. Colour is richly golden, aromas fresh, ripe and complex. Palate was relatively closed when tasted in October 2023, but the fruit concentration was remarkable, with density and well-sustained follow-through (for drinking 2025-2028+).

Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru Les Perrières

These vines grow on stony, well-drained hummocks which filter water away quickly, giving beautifully lively wines. The vineyard was planted in 1987, and we have been buying this wine ever since we first tasted it, even from young vines. It has consistently gained complexity as the roots have penetrated more deeply. Colour is lemon-gold, aromas are fine, fresh and attractive. Palate shows impressive fruit intensity, lemony flavours and bright natural acidity, with energetic aftertaste (for drinking 2025-2030+).

Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru Les Referts

Etienne Sauzet 2022 3x75cl 335.00

These 65-year-old vines grow in clay-rich soil downhill from Premier Cru Les Combettes, near Puligny-Montrachet's border with Meursault. The vineyard always gives intensely fruity wine, which makes a powerful impression on nose and palate, and ages well. Colour is greengolden, the nose being tight, fresh and fine. Palate is broadly-built, seemingly with both flesh and muscle (for drinking 2026-2035+).

Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru Champ Canet

Champ Canet lies at the north of the appellation, bordering Meursault 1er Cru Les Perrières, just uphill from Puligny 1er Cru Les Combettes (see below). With 1.1 hectares of vines here, this is Sauzet's largest First Growth holding, the vines now averaging nearly 70 years of age. 50cm of deep, red clay soil over fractured mother rock encourage vine roots to go down deep. This has benefited from its time on the post-fermentation lees (composed of dead yeast-cells) to take on flavour intensity and texture. In colour it is pale golden, with complex, ripe aromas. Palate recalls golden fruits, with impressive volume in the mouth and creamy, luscious texture (for drinking 2025-2032+).

Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru Les Combettes

Les Combettes is always on very tight allocation, with 70% of the production coming from 60+ year-old vines, whose small berries give a limited, complexly flavoured production. The balance of the vineyard is also now mature, dating from 25 years ago. The vines are planted on terraces bordering the commune boundary with Meursault, just south of that appellation's Meursault-Charmes-dessus. Colour is lemon-golden, aromas are fresh and concentrated, promising complexity. Palate shows exceptional elegance allied to power, with flavours which project harmoniously, way beyond the moment of swallowing this wine. It has marvelous potential for the greatest beauty (for drinking 2025-2035+).

Sauzet's vines are located on the Puligny-Montrachet side of this Grand Cru, which straddles both Puligny and Chassagne. Colour is green-golden, aromas are rich, open, spicy and aromatic. Palate is powerfully built, with amazing fruit concentration, gorgeous, creamy texture and outstanding, charmingly long aftertaste (for drinking 2028-2040+).

Domaine Chapelle de Blagny, Blagny

These vineyards belonged to the Cistercian Abbey of Maizières, from the 12th to 18th centuries. In 1811 they were bought by an ancestor of Etienne de Brechard, the present owner. For 5 generations the family discreetly tended the vines, harvested the grapes - and sold them, until recently, to local merchants. We were the first to discover domaine-bottlings from this exciting estate, and introduce them - new to the UK - with the 2015 vintage. The property is named after a 15th century chapel, next to the winery.

The First Growth vineyards in the hamlet of Meursault-Blagny are less well- known than Meursault First Growths such as Perrières, Genevrières or Charmes, but quality-wise they are up there with the greatest. Due to global warming they are becoming more and more desirable each year, as their altitude protects them from the most torrid heat, allowing precious, natural acidities to be maintained. They lie on high, steep slopes straddling the communes of

Meursault and Puligny-Montrachet. This is classic white wine land, with clay-limestone marls. Domaine Chapelle de Blagny currently cultivates 6 hectares of vines, all concentrated in this zone.

Research is on-going here to identify the best cooper from whom to source the Domaine's new barrel purchases. The recently established artisan barrel-maker Eric Millard's output is proving superb. Oak staves are aged in the open air for three years (this is not unusual, and may be found at several cooperages) but Millard's staves are extra thick, and allowed to heat up gently for three hours over the flames which enable them to be curved. The unfinished barrel is then covered, and allowed to return to normal temperature over 24 hours. So, the toast goes deeply into the wood, and is very light, giving the subtlest results.

Bourgogne Aligoté

Domaine Chapelle de Blagny 2022

We were delighted to introduce this last year, from a vineyard which until recently was rented out. The vines are old, meagre producers, but grape quality is so high that up-rooting them and replanting was out of the question. In 2022, there are three barrels. The grapes have given a beautifully-balanced wine, with just 12.5% abv. Colour is pale, green-lemon, aromas are fresh and intense. Palate is roundly fruity, finishing crisp (for drinking 2024-2026+).

The vines were planted in the 1950s. The wine is bright, green-golden in colour, with open, beautiful, floral aromas. Palate shows lean, tight fruitiness, rich middle and splendid freshness on the finish (for drinking 2025-2034+).

Domaine Chapelle de Blagny 2022

This wine comes from vines which are more than 60 years old. Bunches are tiny, with small grapes. It shows exceptional concentration, with just four barrels being made in 2022. Palate is superb throughout - intensely fruity on the attack, with sustained, fine texture, great smoothness and length (for drinking 2025-2032+).

First Growth red Blagny is one of the rarest, yet finest reds of the Côte de Beaune, with uniquely soft texture. We were delighted, with the 2019, to introduce this exquisite wine for the first time, and the 2022 is again irresistible. The Pinots must be very fine, to give wine of this quality. The bunches were 100% de-stemmed before fermentation, and have given a deeply purple wine of appetisingly ripe, fine aromas. Palate is rich and also charmingly fruity, fresh and round, with soft tannins and gorgeous length (for drinking 2025-2035+).

Domaine Yvon Clerget, Volnay

2015 was the first vintage of the highly talented young winemaker Thibaud Clerget. He completed his studies at Beaune's Lycée Viticole in 2012 and then did vintages with Pinot Noir specialists in New Zealand and Oregon, and on the Côte de Nuits. His family has owned vineyards and made wine in and around Pommard and Volnay since AD 1268, Thibaud being the 28th generation.

If you have rarely encountered bottles from the Domaine, which carries his father's name, this is because since 2010 Yvon Clerget had been selling his grapes, rather than making and bottling his wines. For the 2015 vintage, Thibaud took on the family responsibilities, and all grapes were vinified at the Domaine. We were the first to discover and ship his wines to any export market. Showing his wines at our London Burgundy tasting in January 2017 marked the international launch of this newly thrilling Domaine. Today, his wines are available in 28 countries, so he has told us.

Thibaud made brilliant successes of his first vintages, and many wines sold out rapidly. We are delighted now to be offering his 8th, which is every bit as enthralling as the first seven. Quantities are limited, so please let us know your wishes as soon as possible.

Bourgogne Rouge *Domaine Yvon Clerget 2022*

The grapes come from two sites, Durot and Longbois, the latter lying between Meursault and Volnay. Grapes were 100% de-stemmed, then the wine was oak-aged, in barrels which had held 3 or 4 previous vintages, before racking into tank in October 2023. Bright ruby-purple in colour, this has aromas which are open and ripely fruity. The wine seems to jump out of the mouth, it is so fresh, bright and lively (for drinking 2024-2026+).



Volnay 1er Cru Carelle Sous La Chapelle

Domaine Yvon Clerget 2022

This Premier Cru vineyard lies at Volnay's heart, lying – as the name suggests - just below the village's chapel. Thibaud's wine comes partly from old vines, aged about 75 years old, and partly from 25-year-old vines, giving a Volnay of great purity. When we visited in autumn 2023, this had just been racked, so it was not a good moment to taste. From previous renditions, we know that this will be a wine of substantial body and velvety layers of flavour, and have confidence in it being superb (for drinking 2025-2032+).





Volnay 1er Cru Les Santenots

A part of this vineyard has been up-rooted, so a reduced quantity comes solely from the lower, clay-rich sector of Les Santenots. 20% whole clusters were retained for fermentation, with 20% being aged in new barrels. Colour is purple-red of medium depth, aromas are fragrant, open and fresh. The wine coats the mouth enticingly, with full fruit, gentle tannins and pungent length (for drinking 2025-2032+).

This vineyard is a Monopole, meaning it is solely owned by Thibaud's family. It lies on steeply-sloped land between First Growths Taillepieds and Bousse d'Or, in one of the village's most central and sweetest, First Growth spots. A spring flows across the vineyard, which is partly 43 years old, partly 60. Unusually, the rows of vines run from north to south, meaning that grapes are regularly shaded from sun-burn – contributing to its unusually vibrant freshness. Pommard 1er Cru Les Rugiens

Domaine Yvon Clerget 2022

This is a Pommard Rugiens of elegance, dense fruitiness and superb length. The grapes came equally from the lower and higher sections of the vineyard. Power and richness come from the lower section, balance from the higher. 20% whole bunches went into the fermenting vat bringing spiciness and freshness, and the wine saw 20% new barrels for its ageing. This is Pommard from a Volnay-influenced grower. Colour is of medium depth, aromas rich and open. Palate shows big structure, ripeness and length, with fine acidity and the gentlest of tannins (for drinking 2027-2042+).





These vines lie in the upper part of Clos Vougeot, the Grand Maupertuis section, over the wall from Grands-Echézeaux. As in recent years, half the bunches went into the vat as whole clusters, without de-stemming, and very gentle punching down took place, with the wine then ageing in 50% new barrels. This is ruby-purple of medium depth, with aromas which spring from the glass, very bright and fresh. The wine has power, structure and fruit density, with impressive, well-rounded tannins and superb length - surely one of the greatest Grands Crus of the vintage (for drinking 2028-2050+).

Domaine Joannès Violot-Guillemard, Pommard

This estate is a little-known jewel, making wine in Pommard for 5 generations, farming organically since 1999. 6 hectares in cultivation has now grown to more than 8, thanks to a family inheritance, and Joannès has taken over prime responsibilities from his father Thierry. The latter's philosophies still drive the methods, however. Thierry used to say: "I want to keep my terroirs healthy. No yeasting, no reverse osmosis, not too many technical interventions and not too much wood, so as not to alter the taste of the wine. I love the delicacy and the elegance, the distinctive Pinot, and above all, the fun!" This is very much a family Domaine, with Thierry's wife Estelle, Joannès's mother, being handson throughout the vineyard year, which includes cultivating micro-organisms to vivify the composts. Joannès talks about the small changes he has introduced: "From 2019, we retained a higher proportion of whole bunches in the red wines than in the past, and I decided to rack the reds from barrel before the autumn, in preparation for bottling in November." The pursuit of harmony is constant here, in both colours.

High on the hill above the Pommard vineyard called La Vache, these Chardonnays have again given an appealing, freshly aromatic wine of character and purity. The vines are 40 years old. This is pale lemon in colour, with round fruitiness and vivid aftertaste (for drinking 2024-2026+).

Domaine Boris Champy, Nantoux

In 2020 we were thrilled to introduce, for the first time in the UK, the wines of the highly talented Boris Champy, who had recently taken over running a top estate in the Hautes Côtes de Beaune. These vineyards were originally assembled and brought to prominence by Didier Montchovet, who was a pioneer of organic and biodynamic viticulture, dating back to 1984. Didier had reached retirement age, so handed over to Boris, an oenologist by training, with an impressive wine-making record. He previously worked in Libourne for the Moueix family, in Napa at Dominus estate, for a Beaune shipper, then as manager for Domaine du Clos des Lambrays, in Morey-Saint-Denis.

His main vineyards are at Nantoux, in the hills west of Pommard, with others in the adjoining commune of Bouze-lès-Beaune. Due to the higher altitude of the vines, grapes typically come to ripeness a week or so later than on the Côte de Beaune. This used to be a disadvantage, but with the hotter summers now often experienced in Burgundy, it allows precious freshness to be retained, while simultaneously natural sugars and grape-skins can be slowly brought to ripeness. He also owns some vines in Pommard, with a 1st Growth Beaune Aux Couchérias.

Bourgogne Aligoté Doré Vertical Press 429

Domaine Boris Champy 2022

This comes from a high-altitude vineyard in Nantoux, with its mid-point being at 429 metres. The vines were planted by the visionary Didier Montchovet back in 1987, by which time his estate was certified biodynamic. A departure this year has been to separate 10% of these Aligoté grapes for vertical, hydraulic pressing. It takes much longer - 6 hours, instead of 2 - to extract the juice, but the difference is marked. 

Domaine Seguin-Manuel, Beaune

Seguin-Manuel has links with Burgundy vineyards dating back to 1720. In 2004, the firm with its fine vineyard estate was bought by Thibaut Marion, a scion of the old Beaune family which used to own and manage Chanson Père & Fils. Vines and wine-making were part of Thibaut's DNA. We first tasted his wines when the firm was still based in Savigny, in a 14th century vat-house with splendid, vaulted cellars which had been built by the Abbey of Cîteaux. On the outside wall could be seen one of the Latin inscriptions for which Savigny is famous: "If my memory serves me right, there are five reasons for drinking: the arrival of a guest, present and future thirst, the quality of the wines and any other reason you like – 1772."

Thibaut's estate now covers 5 hectares, and he fine-tuned the wine-making when he moved to a new winery in Beaune. 2022 is the 12th vintage when we have made careful choices, this year finding 11 wines, from the nearly 30 appellations he makes. Thibaut's drive for increased quality and focus has again brought magnificent results. "It's my role to soften the price changes," he tells us. Indeed, it is clear that these wines are again superb value.

This is a rarely seen appellation: Vinzelles touches Fuissé and Chaintré, two of the communes which produce the famous Pouilly-Fuissé. This is the tenth vintage that Thibaut Marion has owned Vosne-Romanée vines - a rare and precious addition to his estate. Having experimented with adding a proportion of whole bunches (for vintages 2013-17) he concluded that, for this vineyard, 100% de-stemming gives more freshness, volume and flesh to the wine, so this has been the policy since 2018. 

Domaine Pavelot, Pernand-Vergelesses

There have been Pavelots tending vines in Pernand since the 17th century, so village records tell us. Today, this 9.5-hectare estate is run by sister and brother Lise & Luc Pavelot, following in the footsteps of father Régis and grandfather Maurice. Most of their vines are in their home village of Pernand-Vergelesses, where they make magnificent First Growths, both white and red, as well as brilliant Corton-Charlemagne, not to mention cutting edge Passetoutgrains and village-level bottlings.

The Domaine has been certified organic since 2009, but no chemical weed-killers had been used for many years prior to then. The soils are tilled by plough, and manually, with occasional, green covercrops, and green-harvesting of grapes, if necessary. Organic composts are the only fertiliser.

Harvesting is by hand, and this is one of the few Domaines in Burgundy where the grapes are gently carried in traditional,

wicker shoulder-baskets down the rows. The philosophy of the Domaine may be summed up as a constant reflection on how to ensure the health of their soils - and hence their vines and wines - with respect for the plant and human environment.

The wines have succulent fruit, with structure, freshness and the gentlest of tannins, for the reds. The whites show beautiful harmony. Both colours represent superb value, some for early drinking, some for mid-term ageing.

The grapes come from several hillside plots around the village, principally Les Quartiers and La Morand, with some from Belles Filles and Sur Herbeux. The wine was 100% vinified in small oak barrels (of which less than 25% were new), and bottled in September 2023. Colour is mid-deep, lemon-gold, aromas are open, fresh and rich. Pernand-Verglesses Blanc 1er Cru En Caradeux

En Caradeux is a steep, east-facing First Growth, lying to your right, just outside the village of Pernand, as you take the road to Beaune. The Pavelot Chardonnays have now reached 14 and 15 years of age, giving intensely rounded, rich wine of great beauty. It you do not know this vineyard, we urge you to experiment - it stands comparison with many more famous plots. Bottled in September 2023, this is pale, lemon-golden, aromas being open, ripe and engaging. Domaine Jean-Baptiste Boudier, Pernand-Vergelesses

Jean-Baptiste Boudier's training took him from Beaune's viticultural school to New Zealand and Roussillon, with 2 years oenology in Bordeaux, including 6 months at Château Haut-Brion. He doesn't believe in pre-fermentation maceration. "I prefer that fermentations start fast," he says. "For my father, colour was very important, but for me, it's not the major factor. Tannins are more important, and we adapt the extractions according to the year, and by tasting." In his avoidance of a pre-fermentation cold-soaking of his grapes, his wine-making is not Burgundian mainstream, but has been carefully thought through, from his own experiences. 2022 is another lovely vintage at the Domaine, with quality and value both outstanding.

Bourgogne Pinot Noir "Les Barrigards"

"I adore this vineyard," says Jean-Baptiste, "with its small grapes and tiny bunches of Pinot, planted 40 years ago. Yield is always small. It's my only regional wine, I'm always happy here." The vines are to be found near the village of Ladoix-Serrigny, at the foot of the Corton hill. 40% whole clusters went into this cuvée, as the grapes were perfectly healthy. Aloxe-Corton Rouge Les Combes

Domaine Jean-Baptiste Boudier 2022

These vines came to Jean-Baptiste from his father for the first time in 2018. They lie downhill from Corton Grand Cru Les Combes, growing on deep, pebble-rich soils, with fine clays. At 80, these vines are the oldest in the Domaine, dating back to 1942. "Every year, systematically, this is the cuvée with the least colour" Jean-Baptiste told us. 30% whole clusters were retained for fermentation, with the wine having been bottled in October 2023. Colour is indeed pale, ruby-purple, then pungent blackberry aromas surge from the glass. Here, 85% of the wines come from their own Domaine, which now has 7.5 hectares in production, mainly in the northern Côte de Beaune. We championed winemaker Jean Lupatelli's work here over the 7 vintages up to 2020, and wish him well in his recent promotion, as winemaker for Domaine Comte Georges de Vogüé. The new winemaker is Thomas Emin, who worked with Lupatelli from 2018 to 2020, and has made superb successes of the 2022s. He has reduced the proportion of new oak barrels (from 30-40% down to 20%) for several cuvées, and is working closely with 3 coopers (instead of 7). He is reducing sulphur levels, and aiming to bottle more reds without fining or filtration. The policy of converting newly acquired vineyards to organic cultivation (and certification) is being continued.

Those with long memories may remember that we used to ship a delicious Bourgogne blanc Les Champlains from the late, much-missed, Patrick Bize. Domaine Faiveley, Nuits-Saint-Georges

Our shipments from this superb source of great Burgundies date back over 30 years, to the 1989 vintage. This is very much a family business, with François Faiveley's children, Erwan and Eve, now at the helm. Winemaker Jérôme Flous and his assistant Bastien Giraud are highly talented, and operate within a rebuilt, spacious, state-of-the-art winery in Nuits-Saint-Georges. The superb 125-hectare Domaine includes 13 different Grands Crus and 25 Premiers Crus.

Since the 2007 vintage, many carefully thought-through changes have taken place, with work in vineyards and wine-making becoming more closely integrated. They invested in gentler means of transporting grapes from sorting tables to vats, up-graded their temperature control systems, installed a new hydraulic press, and fine-tuned the barrel buying – all to great effect. Jérôme Flous has been here for more than a decade, having previously worked as technical consultant for many top Domaines. The wines have been gaining in richness, fruit density, complexity and smoothness, without sacrifice of ageing potential. The rarest and greatest often sell out fast, so please let us know your wishes as soon as possible, to avoid disappointment.

Faiveley has a superb estate on the Côte Chalonnaise, and a separate, newly renovated winery in Mercurey to handle all the fruit as near to the vineyards as possible. The family is the sole proprietor of this vineyard, which vinified two-thirds in stainless steel tank, with the balance in oak barrels. The result is a Chardonnay that has precise, pure lemon fruit character allied with delicate spice and silky texture. Pale, green-lemon colour, this has lively aromas, palate being medium bodied, poised and charmingly concentrated. Corton-Charlemagne Grand Cru

Domaine Faiveley 2022

Corton-Charlemagne is a large Grand Cru, with vineyards on a wide range of soils and sub-soils, facing in different directions. The Faiveley plot of old vines lies high on the hillside, above their Clos des Cortons, facing due east. The rising sun gives the ripening grapes an early advantage, then the plot's easterly exposure ensures the grapes do not over-bake. Nuits-Saint-Georges 1er Cru Les Chaignots

Here two sectors of the Echézeaux vineyard are assembled together. A quarter of the grapes come from Les Quartiers de Nuits, which lies just over the wall from Clos-Vougeot, and the balance from Les Rouges du Bas, higher on the hillside. Domaine J-F Mugnier, Chambolle-Musigny

Nuits-Saint-Georges Clos de la Maréchale has been owned solely by the Mugnier family of Chambolle-Musigny for generations, but the vineyard was let out for cultivation elsewhere, for many years. Frédéric succeeded in claiming it back in 2004: the wine has gone from strength to strength ever since.

"I like the reliable consistency of Clos de la Maréchale," says Mugnier. "Musigny is great, Amoureuses is exciting, but Maréchale is my favourite vineyard." On wine making, Mugnier explains: "All my wines are made in exactly the same way - fermentation, use of wood, time in barrel. Any difference must come from the place, the age of vines, the location. Each wine must be the expression of something that comes from nature."

Concerning the 2022 vintage, Mugnier told us: "I was worried, as the vines were suffering badly from drought and heat, with berries drying in the clusters. I thought that it's going to be awful, there'll be nothing left, and if there is, it may be over-ripe! But a bit of rain in the second half of August changed everything. The wines are rich and fruity enough, supple, fresh and integrated. Drinkable early, and it will develop progressively, with time. It's a very good surprise."

Nuits-Saint-Georges 1er Cru Clos de la Maréchale – Monopole Domaine Jacques-Frédéric Mugnier 2022

Clos de la Maréchale is the most southerly of the Nuits-Saint-Georges vineyards situated in Prémeaux, which is itself known for the richness and generous harmony of its wines, contrasting with the rugged profile of some other Nuits. This 2022 is very deep, ruby-purple, the nose showing both red and black fruit character. Domaine Henri Magnien, Gevrey-Chambertin

This small Domaine has extraordinary vineyard-holdings on the Côte Saint-Jacques. This is the hillside of Gevrey-Chambertin 1st Growths, above the village, which narrowly missed classification as Grands Crus, in the 1930s. Clients with long memories will recall that we shipped wines from this estate in the mid-1980s – when Henri, the grandfather of Charles Magnien, who now runs the estate, was in charge.

Since taking over the reins, Charles has been determinedly bringing it back up to the level which made his grand-father's wines exceptional. Charles makes a point of preserving and propagating the "Pinot Noir Magnien" (about which, see below). Working closely with his cooper, he has developed his own, lightly-flamed but long-time-toasted oak barrels, with the object of eliminating the vanilla or coffee aromas which may come with heavier toasting. "I search to produce fine wine, not tannic wine – wine you can drink young, and keep if you want," says Charles. He is a new star in Gevrey-Chambertin, whose wines we were the first to re-introduce to UK Burgundy-lovers. We are thrilled to offer them again.

This was a new arrival in the Domaine, last year. The 45-year-old vines are located within the Queue de Hareng hillside plot which lies between Gevrey-Chambertin and Brochon. One day it may be upgraded, for this is a fine site, on similar contours to nearby First Growths. Colour is rich, purple-ruby, aromas are open, buoyant and youthful. Palate is exuberantly fruity (for drinking 2025-2030+).

Gevrey-Chambertin Vieilles Vignes

Domaine Henri Magnien 2022

This comes from 8 different plots of 40- to 100-year old vines, with the vineage averaging about 65 years. Many plots are planted with the Pinot Noir Magnien, whose existence dates from 1850, yielding grapes with thick skins, giving little juice. This was 100% de-stemmed. Gevrey-Chambertin 1er Cru Estournelles Saint Jacques

"We had 120mm of rain in Gevrey-Chambertin on 22nd June 2022", Magnien reminded us, "and the water went into people's letter-boxes, flooding several cellars - but it saved the vintage, protecting it from dryness." This vineyard is high on the hillside, facing due south, giving a wine which is full of energy. Breezes coming down the little valley beside these First Growths on the Côte Saint Jacques help to evaporate liquid from the berries, concentrating the juices. The vines are around 60 years old. Bright, ruby purple in colour, this has shy aromas, but they're delicately beautiful. Palate is solid and rich from start to finish, with fresh, harmonious aftertaste (for drinking 2026-2036+).

This is the smallest individual First Growth cuvée that Charles Magnien makes from the Côte Saint Jacques. It comes from old vines which average 70 years of age. This is suave and pure, a densely fruity wine, with splendid richness excellent middle and fine tannins (for drinking 2027-2040+).

This is Charles Magnien's largest Premier Cru holding, and the wine with which he most closely identifies - his parents' home is exactly at the foot of these vines. Les Cazetiers is certainly one of the most fascinating First Growths of the Côte de Nuits, and the Magnien family is understandably proud of their substantial 1.47 hectare holding. Rich, ruby-purple in colour, this has spectacularly complex, beautiful aromas. Domaine Henri Magnien is the only owner with plots in both sectors of this Grand Cru, Ruchottes du dessus (white oolite subsoil), and Ruchottes du bas (Prémeaux limestone). This certainly contributes to the extraordinary richness, complexity, harmony and finesse of this wine. The average age of the vines – 45-50 years – no doubt also plays a vital part. There is never much of this - just three barrels in 2022, the colour being bright ruby, aromas being open, rich and ripe. This is completely integrated, melding balanced structure with broad, lively fruitiness, lovely, soft tannins and fantastic length (for drinking 2026-2040+).

Maison Laroze de Drouhin, Gevrey-Chambertin

Laroze de Drouhin is the négociant wing of Domaine Drouhin-Laroze, set up in 2008 by Caroline Drouhin. It has enabled the family to supplement their supply of grapes, increasing their range of wines and appellations. As Caroline explains: "We do not own these plots, but manage and work the vineyards with the owners, hand-harvesting ourselves, and making the wines with the same attention to detail that we bring to the wines of our Domaine". Caroline and her winemaker brother Nicolas have found it fascinating to work with new terroirs. These wines are great value, and delightful.

"These grapes come solely from the Côte de Nuits, from land under the Chambolle-Musigny and Morey-Saint-Denis appellations, with some Gevrey-Chambertin commune grapes," says Caroline. This is deep, purple-ruby, with freshly open, clean fruitiness on the nose. The palate gives an intensely fruity, chewy impression, lively and fresh (for drinking 2024-2026+).

Domaine Drouhin-Laroze, Gevrey-Chambertin

This long-established Domaine has magnificent vineyard-holdings in the northern Côte de Nuits, with many First Growths, and also no less than six of the greatest Grands Crus. The three First Growths we have chosen to list this year -Gevrey-Chambertin Craipillots, Clos Prieur and Lavaut Saint Jacques - are outstanding, and so too are Chapelle-Chambertin, Latricières-Chambertin, Clos-Vougeot, Bonnes Mares, and Chambertin Clos de Bèze. The Musigny is amazing (though our allocation is minuscule). All barrels age in perfect conditions of humidity and temperature in underground, two-storied cellars which date back to construction after Waterloo, around 1825. Many subtle improvements were introduced here as Philippe Drouhin took over from his father Bernard. Now we have witnessed a second generational change, as Philippe and his wife Christine encourage their wellqualified children Nicolas and Caroline to take over the reins. In the past, all grape-bunches were de-stemmed, but now


different proportions (typically 30%) of whole clusters are added to many cuvées. From village-level offerings up to the rarest Grands Crus, these wines offer superb quality and are great value for money, across the range.



Gevrey-Chambertin Dix Climats

Domaine Drouhin-Laroze 2022

The Domaine owns 4 hectares of village-level Gevrey-Chambertin, from which they regularly make one of the most impressive examples of the appellation. This wine has been ageing in oak barrels previously used for one vintage. Colour is a bright, red-purple of medium depth, with fresh aromas including pepper and blackberries. Palate shows vibrant fruitiness, with smooth tannins and balanced, fresh finish (for drinking 2025-2030+).



Morey-Saint-Denis Très Girard

The Très Girard vineyard is near Morey's restaurant of the same name. "We forgot to say Stop to the whole bunches, in 2017," admits Nicolas, so 90% went into that wine – which proved to be lovely. He adds: "That was an accident, now it's a tradition!" – with 50% being included in the 2022. Rich purple in colour, this shows spicy, ripe fruitiness, very appealing. The palate is plump and powerfully built, with many layers of character and fresh, long finish (for drinking 2026-2032+).
